Message to Parties

This notification is being sent to Parties and Observer States to the Convention. It is addressed to their National Focal Points for Climate Change. For those Parties that have not yet identified National Focal Points, the message is being sent to their Diplomatic Missions accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany; for those Parties not accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany, it is being sent to Permanent Missions in New York or Ministries of Foreign Affairs as appropriate. In all cases, the communication is copied to the Diplomatic Missions accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany and the Permanent Missions to the United Nations Office at Geneva.

The secretariat would like to recall the upcoming agreed deadlines for the submission of information or views from Parties. A chronological summary table for all upcoming deadlines arising from the tenth, eleventh and twelfth sessions of the subsidiary bodies and from COP 5 is attached to this message. The table includes references to the appropriate documents. As the reports of the sessions have not yet been finalized (to be issued as FCCC/SBI/2000/5 and FCCC/SBSTA/2000/5) references to in-session documents are used for the twelfth sessions.

In order for the documents to be produced in a timely manner for the next sessions, it is important that the submissions reach us on time. The secretariat also wishes to recall that documents can be produced faster from electronic submissions, either on diskette or via electronic mail. E-mail submissions should be sent to secretariat@unfccc.int; receipt will be acknowledged. Submissions formatted in MS Word 97 are preferable but formats in other electronic software are welcome too. Where non-electronic submissions are provided, more time is needed to produce the document.

As submissions are compiled on an issue-by-issue basis, the secretariat requests that each submission be identified by its subject and mandate and, if possible, sent as a separate document.

The secretariat would also like to take advantage of this opportunity to convey information to Parties on the schedule for inter-sessional activities up to the Lyon sessions. Some of the dates and venues remain subject to change and will be confirmed in the letters of invitation.
