PERU STATEMENT IN FINAL PLENARY MEETING

Co-Chairs:

We want to thank you and all the Parties for their efforts this week. Under your guidance, the facilitators have done a great effort, and we commend them for having brought parties forward towards substantive dialogue and bridging proposals.

We acknowledge that an important conceptual evolution and some textual improvements have been obtained. These results should be captured in the facilitators' reports, along with their understanding of the key issues, section by section, in light of the discussions this week.

At the same time, we are aware that progress has been insufficient and uneven. Three months before Paris, the pace is slow and the current tool is evidently not the best suitable for effective deliberations.

Therefore, Co-Chairs, we thank you for having presented a clear proposal for the next steps, a proposal that you have elaborated after having heard the guidance from the Parties.

We have noted a general call for you to present, after this session, a basis for the negotiation that captures the progress made so far, for both workstreams.

Our common expectation is for you to prepare a concise, single, consolidated document; a document which corrects imbalances; which is inclusive and not restrictive in terms of content; which includes crystalized, manageable options; and which creates a better articulation, for all central issues, between the core agreement and the COP decisions.

We also see convergence on the need to improve the format and the modalities of our work; to move towards a more centralized forum of negotiation; to address all elements as a whole, in a comprehensive manner; to benefit from a more direct stewardship from your part during the sessions; to consider more instances of deliberation at the head of delegation level.

Co-Chairs, we encourage you to make full use of your mandate to move the process forward.

Peru, both as acting Presidency and as a developing country, is responsibly involved in a solid working partnership with France. This is why, during the next ADP session we intend to convene, together with the incoming Presidency, consultation meetings with heads of delegations to support the work of the Co-Chairs.

As we move into the final stages of the process, we renew our pledge to collaborate with France for the success of COP21.

Let me finish by thanking the contributing countries that have made pledges to ensure the realization of the next ADP session.
