## Statement by COP 20 and CMP 10 Presidency Ambassador Jorge Voto-Bernales Ad Hoc Working Group on the Durban Platform for Enhanced Action (ADP) 11 June 2015, Bonn, Germany

Dear Co-Chairs,

In this final plenary of the ADP June meeting, the Peruvian Presidency of COP20/CMP11 would like to make the following remarks:

First, we want to express our deep appreciation for the professionalism and transparency that you have shown, Co-Chairs, in guiding us through this difficult negotiations. We want to commend you, in particular, for the unprecedented exercise of inclusiveness you have shown in this session. You have established a practice of intensive and subsequent rounds of bilateral consultations with all the negotiating blocks, a practice that represents a substantial improvement for our process.

Second, the Peruvian Presidency also supports your suggestions on the way forward for the preparation of our next meeting, which you propose on the basis of the views expressed by all Parties. We support in particular the assistance you will provide to Parties, with the help of the Co-Facilitators and the Secretariat, by preparing for the 24th of July a scenario note containing, as a tool, a fully streamlined, consolidated, clear and concise version of the Geneva Negotiating Text that will not omit any option or position of Parties.

Third, we encourage you to pursue intensive inter-sessional consultations with all Parties with a view to avoiding any procedural discussion at the opening of the next ADP meeting. Indeed, it is essential that, on August 26<sup>th</sup>, all Parties are ready to engage in substantial negotiations which means, in our mind, engaging in an effort to reduce options in each section, search compromises in each paragraph and exchange views on the broad picture, on the general balances and trade-offs which will make the Paris agreement universal, durable and transformative. In this work, we look forward to the future assistance of the several Co-Facilitators, whom we thank very much for their hard work during this session.

Fourth, we want to tell all of you, dear colleagues from all Parties, that the Peruvian Presidency will continue, until COP21, to foster dialogue between all groups, between developed and developing countries, to find reasonable and responsible compromises. In doing so, we must be attentive to each other's concerns, which are all legitimate. We have diverse economic and social realities and, consequently, varying levels of flexibility for different issues. We must engage in real negotiations in August attentive to this diversity, but also focused on results.

Finally, fifth, we want to express our strong expectation to start the next ADP session with a substantial working document on Workstream 2 issues which takes full stock of the proposals and positions presented during this session.

In this context, Peru will continue to support the increasing leadership of the incoming French Presidency. We are totally convinced that COP21 will be a success, a success that all our Governments, economies and societies are urgently expecting.
