Intro

we <u>need</u> to take decisive steps towards the ultimate goal - a legally binding outcome.

We simply need to build the strongest foundation possible.

As you say here in Mexico:

"If the house is built on the rock, it will remain, despite strong winds and storms"

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Let's be frank with one another, it is <u>not</u> going to be an easy ride here in the **Moon Palace**.



But with the <u>excellent stewardship</u> of our Mexican host,

the <u>support</u> of the Secretariat and the <u>guidance</u> of our two chairs,

And with YOUR determined collective effort, it's my hope that we'll have the same experience as one of the astronauts travelling to the real moon – I quote

"When you're finally up at the moon looking back on earth, all those differences and nationalistic traits are pretty well going to blend, and you're going to get a concept that <u>maybe</u> this really <u>is</u> one world ..."
