Ladies and gentlemen,

Welcome to the opening of the high-level segment of the eighteenth session of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and the eighth session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol.

Honourable ministers, when you approached the convention centre, I am sure you noticed the unique look of this facility. The front of the building is built to resemble a Sidra tree, an iconic symbol of Qatar. - There is a firm foundation laid for a long-term framework that is applicable to all, equitably instituted and responsive to science.

Excellencies, coming from all corners of the world, you gather today under the Sidra tree. Your unequivocal guidance is needed to transform this symbol of perseverance, solidarity and determination into authoritative action.

This will happen only if you work with purposeful perseverance, show true solidarity and demonstrate determination to act with ambition and urgency. Present and future generations are counting on you.
