TRANSPORTATION DURING COP17

SHUTTLE SYSTEM:

There is a free shuttle system for Participants that will operate from central point's near to many of the larger hotels and accommodation venues. A full map of the shuttle system is available on the website www.cop17-cmp7durban.com in the Durban> Getting Around section.

Unfortunately it is not possible to provide shuttle services to all accommodation establishments. Participants are encouraged to consult the maps on the website or to call Carol Savides during office hours on 031 311 4734 to get information on the closest shuttle pick-up point to where they are staying. (In addition, Durban's Public Transport Call Centre 0861 000 834 will provide information on public transport options in Durban)

The times of this service are as follows:

06h00 – 24h00 every day at 10 – 15 minute intervals between
 06h00 – 10h00 and 15h00 – 19h00, otherwise hourly.

DROP OFF'S:

Stopping or parking is prohibited on Bram Fischer Rd (Ordnance). It is recommended that Participants who are dropped off are dropped at the Park and Ride site (see below). From there Participants can get the shuttle to the Central Transport Hub and walk across to the ICC.

Participants and members of the public can be dropped off in streets adjacent to the CCR Expo and ICC precinct, e.g. Monty Naiker (Pine), although this method is not preferred due to the congestion it creates.

PARK AND RIDE:

Participants can be dropped off, or can park at the Park and Ride at the old Drive-In site at Stalwart Simelane Rd (Stanger) and Sylvester Ntuli Rd (Brickhill). Shuttles run every 15 minutes. Escorted vehicles and VIPs need to enter the Remote Search Park alongside the Park & Ride first, in order to be escorted into the Precinct.

BICYCLES:

Bicycles are available for the use of Participants at no cost. These may be collected from and returned to the Central Transport Hub.

PEDESTRIANS:

In addition to the main entrance on the Climate Change Response Site, there is an entrance for pedestrians to the ICC on the corner of Bram Fischer Ave and Stalwart Simelane Rd.

METERED TAXIS:

The Metered Taxi Pick Up and Drop Off area is on Bram Fischer Ave – between Stalwart Simelane Rd and Florence Nzama Ave, on the northern side of the ICC. Taxis will not be allowed to drop off Participants anywhere else along Bram Fischer (Stanger).

TRANSPORT OPTIONS FOR PHYSICALLY CHALLENGED PARTICIPANTS

Dial a Ride is a safe, accessible service provided through Durban Municipality to assist with transport for wheelchair users and others who find the other transport services inaccessible. Register with the call centre (open every day from 06h00 – 18h30) to arrange bookings and to quote on the applicable transport costs. Please phone 0860 662 453 or email 0860rolling@iafrica.com. Please request reservations well in advance – especially if transport is required to/from the airport.

A vehicle for physically challenged Participants, operated by the City of Durban will run from the Park and Ride to the ICC. The Vehicle will drop the delegate off at the Arena Entrance of the ICC. Please note that this vehicle does need to go through the remote search park prior to arriving at the ICC which may involve extra time. This vehicle will depart from the Park and Ride at 08h00 and depart from the ICC at 17h00 daily.
