Africa struggling to acquire technology to mitigate climate change

Accra, Ghana (PANA) - Developing countries are struggling to get technology that is required to address climate change, an African member of the United Nations F ramework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) disclosed here.

William Agyemang-Bonsu from Ghana, disclosed at the ongoing Climate Change Talks that this was happening despite the Kyoto Protocol which says that the extent to which the developed countries can take action in not only mitigation but also a daptation, will depend on the extent to which developed countries transfer technology to developing countries.

"If technologies are not coming in, this reduces our effort, even if we are maki ng efforts in trying to reduce emission, we will not be able to achieve this bec a use we do not have appropriate technologies.

"The argument and resistance is that technology is not there to take but if you want it, go for it, go and buy it, it is on the market and it is not in the hand s of governments, it is with the private sector," Agyemang-Bonsu told PANA.
