The United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change in partnership with Mark Terry, a PhD student at Toronto's York University, will hold a press conference:

to announce a new data delivery system for delegates to use at the COP conferences. The system is an interactive Geographic Information System map incorporating 250 videos of new climate research reported by students around the world. This visualization of data includes links to profiled researchers and their institutions as well as a current 360-degree photograph of the area where the research is taking place.

The digital map contains all 180 video entries in the Global Youth Video Competition this year, including the two winning entries. It was developed by Mark Terry as part of his PhD research into how documentary film can be mobilized as an instrument of policy and social change. A demonstration of how the map works will be provided at the Press Conference.
