Daily subsistence allowance	Delegates from Parties eligible for funding may collect their daily subsistence allowance from the Administration Office, located adjacent to the Computer Centre in the gallery on the first floor. The office will be open on Monday, 16 May (erroneously shown as Tuesday 17 May in the booket <i>Information for participants</i>).		
Documentation	Documentation relating to the twenty-second sessions of the subsidiary bodies is available from the Documents Distribution counter in the corridor between the main entrance and Saal Maritim.

The **Media Information Counter** is located in the **Media Centre**. The counter facilitates the booking of press conferences and interviews with United Nations officials or delegates.

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<PlugNplay> and <Wireless> network services

Free Internet (PlugNplay and wireless) network services are available to participants throughout the conference. Services are available in two categories. There is no need to make any changes to your system in either case.

Category #1: loose network (nodes) cables placed at specific locations in the media and computer centres. To use this service, simply plug the cable into your PC or laptop. Look out for a black cable (Computer Centre/Laptop Centre) or yellow cable (Exhibitions area).

Category #2: WiFi (Wireless fidelity) network services throughout the conference facility. To use this service, you need a computer equipped with a wireless network component. The wireless network is identified by the name PlugNplay. Choose the PlugNplay point with the highest % availability for better service. No changes need to be made to your system to take advantage of this service. The best "HOT SPOTS" are indicated with PlugNplay banners all around the conference facility.

Word of caution!

The PlugNplay network is open with no restrictions or protection. In order to remain safe, please follow these best practice tips:

- Install and/or update your ANTIVIRUS software
- Activate your PERSONAL FIREWALL if your computer has the software installed.
 WindowsXP users should activate the WINDOWS FIREWALL feature.
- Assign your computer a suitable name e.g. your organization, company or delegation
