

Structure of chapter III

- Report distils themes and issues in the submissions
- Technical and legal issues identified
 - Site selection
 - Project boundaries and GHG accounting
 - Transboundary issues
 - Risk, safety and socio-environmental assessment
 - Monitoring
 - Permanence and liability
- Issues cover all aspects of decisions 2/CMP.5 and 7/CMP.6



Structure of chapter IV

- Seeks to identify possible modalities and procedures to address concerns raised at a technical and legal level
- Translation of ideas into M&P is as yet incomplete
- Many submissions sought mutatis mutandis approach
 - Most provisions remain valid for CCS projects
 - Only add to or change provisions where warranted by CCS needs
 - Chapter IV structured in line with standards CDM M&P
- Everything is connected many issues will need addressing through multiple aspects of the M&P acting in unison
- Many areas of convergence though details will take time
