



Europe's Programme for Research 2007-2013: The Seventh Framework Programme


- Regional programme for funding research in Europe and beyond
- Managed by the European Union
- Financial contributions from 27 EU + 12 Associated Countries*
- Multiannual programme
- FP7 Budget: >50 000 M€ over 7 years complex
- Structured around Specific Programmes. 3 key entry points here:
 - ▶ 1. Cooperation collaborative research
 - 2. Capacities capacity building for research
 - ▶ 3. People individual fellowships and grants

The Framework Programme: How it works

For all FP7 programmes:

- Implemented through <u>annual calls for proposals</u>
- On a competitive basis (scientific excellence, impact)
- Participation open to research actors from <u>anywhere</u> in the world
- Funding conditions for developing countries and transition economies: comparable to those for EU/Associated countries

FP7 Funding Opportunities: Collaborative Research (Cooperation programme)

What does FP7 collaborative research look like?

- Collaborative research under FP7 means research projects carried out by <u>transnational consortia</u> (min 3 countries)
- Annual calls for proposals in (mostly) pre-defined topics
- 3 key priorities Climate Change collaborative research
 - Understanding the past, present and future of the climate system and its processes
 - Quantifying climate change impacts on humans and nature
 - Identifying and assessing mitigation and adaptation options

Collaborative research with mixed consortia

FP7 portfolio of climate change research projects includes, in particular, a number of projects which:

- Focus on issues of importance to the developing world
- Consortia with strong developing country representation
- Carried out in developing countries

Mutual benefit:

- Developing countries bring essential knowledge and expertise of the local natural and political landscape
- Projects include components for knowledge transfer and capacity building, and offer opportunities for increased visibility and integration into global research community

Success stories in CC collaborative research

DEWFORA (2010-2013):

Improved drought early warning and forecasting to strengthen preparedness and adaptation to droughts in Africa

- Improved drought forecasting, warning and response;
- Enhanced resilience and drought mitigation measures through increased preparedness and adaptation;
- Dissemination: through stakeholder engagement (national/regional forecasting agencies, NGOs) and capacity-building programmes.



- 19 partners, of which 8 from African countries
- ► FP7 Contribution: 3.5 M€





Success stories in CC collaborative research

REDD-ALERT (2009-2012):

Reducing emissions from deforestation and degradation through alternative land uses in rainforests of the Tropics

Case studies in SE Asia, Africa and South America to:

- Better understand the drivers of land use change;
- Develop policy options to address tropical deforestation;
- Develop negotiation support tools at international, national and local scales to incorporate REDD into post-2012 climate agreements



- 12 partners, of which 8 from Africa, SE Asia, South America
- ► FP7 Contribution: 3.45 M€






Success stories in CC collaborative research

CLIMB/WasserMed/CLICO (2010-2013):

Cluster of three projects addressing the impacts of climate change on water and security in the Mediterranean Region study areas

- Integrated monitoring and modelling system to reduce uncertainties in climate change impact analysis (CLIMB)
- Quantification of risks including socioeconomic factors (WASSERMed)
- Climate change, hydrological impact on national security and armed conflicts. Vulnerability and adaptation (CLICO)

FP7 Funding Opportunities: Capacities – Capacity Building for Research

- The 'Capacities' Specific Programme has an international cooperation (INCO) component which aims to:
 - strengthen research capacity in Europe and beyond
 - promote cooperation opportunities with third countries/regions
 - ▶ facilitate participation of research actors from third countries in FP7 projects
- Regional (INCO-NET) or country (BILAT) coverage
 - ▶ Bilateral projects: S&T cooperation agreement with EU
- Activities include:
 - Developing information platforms
 - Awareness, dissemination and training in the targeted region/country
 - Assistance in forming research partnerships





Capacity building: Success stories

Platforms for International Cooperation (INCO-NETs): Examples in Latin America and the Caribbean

- EULARINET (2008-2012)
 EU-Latin American Research and Innovation Networks
 - ▶ 19 Partners: 11 from Europe + Colombia, Uruguay, Brazil, Chile, Nicaragua, Argentina, Mexico
 - Biodiversity and Climate Change amongst identified priorities
- EUCARINET (2010-2014)
 Fostering EU-Caribbean Research and Innovation Networks
 - ▶ 12 Partners: 5 from EU +Guyana, French Guyana, Cuba, Netherlands Antilles, Jamaica, Dominican Republic
- ENLACE (2009-2013)
 Enhancing Scientific Cooperation between the EU and Central America
 - ▶ 15 Partners: 7 from EU + Costa Rica, Guatemala, Mexico, Panama, Honduras, Nicaragua









FP7 Funding Opportunities: People – Fellowships and Grants

- The 'People' Specific Programme is implemented through fellowships/grants ('Marie Curie Actions')
- 2007-2009: 81M€ in fellowships for researchers in CC
- Incoming and outgoing
- Open to researchers
 - Of any nationality
 - At any career stage
 - In any discipline





Key Messages

- Europe's Regional Programme for Research (FP7):
 - Collaborative research projects, capacity bulding actions, fellowships
 - Operates on a competitive basis (eg. scientific excellence, impact)
 - Participation open to research actors from <u>anywhere in the world</u>, including for research in and by developing countries
- Instruments exist to build research capacity in developing countries and promote access to FP7 funding opportunities
- Developing country involvement in FP7 activities mutually enriching
- The funds exist to support (increased) participation from research actors from the developing world
