Background

COP 22: Launch of the Marrakech Partnership for Global Climate Action, which is to:

- Provide a basis to maximize collaboration and cooperation among stakeholders
- Ensure the realization of existing commitments
- Facilitate a greater number of and more ambitious commitments

Mission

Aims to mobilize the broadest possible coalition of actors to urgently deliver the immediate mitigation and adaptation actions required to achieve the long-term goals of the Paris Agreement and enable the achievement of the SDGs.



Value Added

The Marrakech Partnership will add value to the efforts of Parties to enhance climate action in the pre-2020 period by:

- Recruiting new constituencies to assist in the implementation of climate action;
- Providing practical opportunities to enhance immediate implementation to a support Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) and National Adaption Plans (NAPs) at lower cost;
- Diffusing low-carbon and climate-preparedness solutions and best practices, with a view to improving accessibility of developing countries to low-carbon and climate resilient technologies and knowledge;
- Raising the profile of actions being undertaken.



The Marrakech Partnership will assist the efforts of non-Party stakeholders by:

- Raising their profile in the UNFCCC process and beyond through tools like the High-Level Event, NAZCA, the Yearbook of Climate Action, existing communications activities of the UNFCCC, etc.;
- Linking the solutions that they offer to opportunities for national governments, for example via the Technical Expert Meetings (TEMs), the Yearbook, the High-level Event, and creating cooperation and collaboration;
- Amplifying the impact of immediate individual or sectoral mitigation and adaptation
 actions through a common narrative of economy-wide transformation to deliver on the
 goals of the Paris Agreement as quickly as possible;
- Facilitating the translation of the long-term goal of the Paris Agreement into short term operational actions for a range of stakeholder groups.



Current work

- Consultations with a broad range of coalitions, initiatives and organizations
- Publication of the proposed approach (4 May)
- Consultations with Parties (May sessions in Bonn and afterwards)
- Publication of the work programme for the Marrakech Partnership and the plan for COP

Approach: Champions and UNFCCC support unit



Champions' core role: engage for strengthening initiatives and coalitions through high-level advocacy, including communication of success and barriers faced in implementation

UNFCCC support unit:

- Convene stakeholders to enable enhanced cooperation
- Facilitate connection with other established UNFCCC processes and bodies
- Enable transparency in reporting through NAZCA
- **Support reporting of progress**, in particular through the Summary of Policymakers and the Yearbook of Global Climate Action
- Provide operational support to the High-level Champions and the knowledge transfer and continuity of functions to future Champions

Approach: stakeholder structure



The approach also contains how to organize the broad range of engaged stakeholders, in order to structure the informal arrangements for transparency

Structure:


- <u>Climate Action Leadership Network</u>: senior decision-makers to commit to aligning their organizations activities with the aims of the Paris Agreement, enable more structure on high-level engagement in the UNFCCC process, and allow new voices on climate action to emerge
- <u>Climate Action Collaboration Forum</u>: a broad range of stakeholder groups, international organizations, sectoral expert organizations, coalitions, initiatives and alliances to align their efforts through the Marrakech Partnership
- <u>Communities of Climate Action Practice</u>: informal communities for enhancing the connections between various stakeholders engaged directly in implementation (Party and non-Party)



- Thematic action events or action days
- High-Level Event on Global Climate Action
- **High-level roundtables** with focus on:
 - "SDG2: End Hunger, Achieve Food Security and Improved Nutrition and Promote Sustainable Agriculture": the impact of climate change on fisheries; approaches to water resource management to ensure food security; impacts of soil salinization due to sea-level rise; the resiliency of current cropping systems; management of soil organic carbon; livestock management; and transport and storage efficiency
 - "SDG11: Make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable": urban planning for resilience in coastal cities, energy efficiency buildings, decarbonization of urban transport, water and sanitation in the context of climate induced water scarcity and excess (flooding) and salinization

High-level engagement



Finance

- Narrative: move the billions to the trillions what is really happening and what needs to happen; what are the opportunities
- Thematic finance
- Innovative products
- Focus on success: including ministers of finance, mayors, and investors (decarbonization pathway, exceeding targets) how to mainstream climate finance and what are the conditions for success?
- NDCs as catalyzers and how to turn it into investment plans

Resilience

- Unblocking (justifying) investment in resilience: Focus on private investment in resilience but recognition that public finance will
 often be needed to mobilize private investment
- SIDS and resilience: They face particular challenges and need particular solutions
- Nature based solutions for resilience: Cuts across the Sendai, SDG and UNFCCC agendas and across the thematic areas

Innovation

- Align the research and innovation agendas of the public and private sectors.
- Transition in the private sector starting with isolated action, moving to collaboration within sectors, across supply chains and now across value chains;
- Align the public and private sector innovation agendas so that they complement each other;
- Successful examples of the public and private sectors reinforcing each other to show what is needed to implement the Paris Agreement;
