Technical Examination Processes (TEPs) and Technical Expert Meetings (TEMs)

- experts meet regularly with stakeholders
- enables the free flow of information, from showcasing ideas, demonstrating best practices, and sharing lessons learned
- outcomes from these meetings are made freely available and are easily accessible and assist with, inter alia, technology transfer and capacity building.

Our proposal: Relocate the TEPs and TEMs into the Article 6.8 work programme.

- align clearly with the principles already agreed upon for non-market approaches;
- established programmes for considering policy approaches;
- promote mitigation and adaptation ambition;
- enhance public and private sector participation;
- enable opportunities for coordination.

A practical solution that:

- advances the objectives of the Framework;
- recognises the body of work already undertaken by the TEMs;
- leverages the foundation of the TEP;
- provides certainty of continuation of the technical examination processes after 2020;
- adheres to the agreed-upon principles set out for a non-market approach in Article 6.8.

A draft decision

The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement,

1. *Decides* to establish a work programme under the framework for non-market approaches to sustainable development with the objective of considering how to enhance linkages and create synergy between, inter alia, mitigation, adaptation, finance, technology transfer and capacity-building, and how to facilitate the implementation and coordination of non-market approaches as established by Article 6, paragraph 9 of the Paris Agreement;
2. *Decides* that the work programme ... should be organized jointly by the Subsidiary Body for Implementation and the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice.
3. *Decides* to include in the work programme established above for the period 2021 – 2025:
 - a) the existing technical examination process on mitigation...
 - b) the existing technical examination process on adaptation...

A draft decision

The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement,

5. *Requests* the subsidiary bodies and the mandated bodies when conducting the two elements of two programme to engage with and explore ways to take into account, synergize with and build on the existing arrangements for both adaptation and mitigation-related work programmes, bodies and institutions under the Convention and the Agreement so as to ensure coherence within the work programme and maximum value of the work programme;
