Climate Change Mitigation Highlights

The last decade Romina has dedicated her efforts to promote and catalyze fast mitigation actions. She helped to found the Climate and Clean Air Coalition to reduce short-lived climate pollutants. She works with developing countries on actions to reduce air pollution and mitigate climate change. She was instrumental in getting the Kigali Amendenment to the Montreal Protocol to phase down HFCs which is estimated to deliver up to 0.5C of avoided warming. She is currently focused on increasing energy efficiency while implementing the Kigali Amendmetn which can deliver another 0.5C of avoided warming
