INFORMATION FOR PARTIES

Nomination of officers for election to bodies under the Convention and its Kyoto Protocol

This is to inform Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and to its Kyoto Protocol that, during the seventeenth session of the Conference of the Parties (COP 17) and the seventh session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP 7), members and/or alternate members will be elected, appointed or endorsed, as appropriate, to the following bodies:

- the Bureau of the COP and the CMP;
- the Bureau of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI);
- the Bureau of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA);
- the Executive Board of the clean development mechanism (CDM EB);
- the Joint Implementation Supervisory Committee (JISC);
- the Compliance Committee;
- the Adaptation Fund Board (AFB);
- the Consultative Group of Experts on National Communications from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (CGE).

Parties may wish to note that should the COP or the CMP decide to continue the mandates of the Ad Hoc Working Groups under the Convention and the Kyoto Protocol, respectively the AWG-LCA and AWG-KP, Parties will be invited to submit nominations to both bodies for election during the session in Durban.

Parties are also informed that, should the COP reach agreement on the mandates and/or composition of the following three new bodies established by the Cancun Agreements (see Decision 1/CP.16), Parties may also be invited to submit nominations during COP 17:

- the Adaptation Committee;
- the Standing Committee;
- the Board of the Green Climate Fund.

Information on the criteria for membership for these bodies, as well as information on the current and former members of various bodies, are contained in the annex and appendices to this Notification.

The President of COP 16 and CMP 6 has requested Ms. Andrea Garcia, Vice President of the COP and CMP, and Mr. Andrej Kranje, Rapporteur of the COP and CMP, to conduct consultations on the nominations on her behalf.

Consultations on the nominations began during the sessions of the subsidiary bodies, held in Bonn from 6 to 17 June 2011, and continued during the sessions of the Ad Hoc Working Groups, held in Panama City from 1 to 7 October 2011. The consultations will continue during the sessions in Durban.

It is recommended that Parties consult within their respective regional groups or constituencies concerning these nominations. Parties are also invited to recall decision 36/CP.7 and give active consideration to the nomination of women.

Following completion of the consultations, the nominations will be forwarded to the COP, CMP or subsidiary body for further action, as appropriate, in accordance with the relevant rules of procedure and decisions of the COP and the CMP.

In order to facilitate an orderly process in the final hours of the Conference and in the interest of transparency, regional groups and constituencies are invited to submit all nominations by 8 p.m. on Thursday, 8 December 2011.

Annex

CRITERIA FOR MEMBERSHIP OF BODIES ESTABLISHED UNDER THE CONVENTION AND ITS KYOTO PROTOCOL

A. The Bureau of the COP and the CMP

1. The draft rules of procedure of the COP, being applied, state that: "At the commencement of the first meeting of each ordinary session, a President, seven Vice-Presidents, the Chairmen of the subsidiary bodies established by Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention, and a Rapporteur shall be elected from among the representatives of the Parties present at the session. They will serve as the Bureau of the session. Each of the five regional groups shall be represented by two Bureau members and one Bureau member shall represent the small island developing states. The offices of President and Rapporteur shall normally be subject to rotation among the five regional groups." No officer may serve on the Bureau for more than two consecutive terms of one year.¹

2. The Kyoto Protocol provides that: "When the Conference of the Parties serves as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol, any member of the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties representing a Party to the Convention but, at that time, not a Party to this Protocol, shall be replaced by an additional member to be elected by and from amongst the Parties to this Protocol".²

3. At COP 17, the COP will be invited to elect, for a term of one year, 11 members of the COP and CMP Bureau as follows:

- 2 members from the African States (Africa);
- 2 members from the Asia-Pacific States (Asia-Pacific);
- 2 members from the Eastern European States (Eastern Europe);
- 2 members from the Latin American and Caribbean States (GRULAC);
- 2 members from the Western European and Other States (WEOG);
- 1 member from the Small Island Developing States (SIDS).

4. Groups/constituencies are invited to submit nominations to the COP and CMP Bureau. At the opening of COP 17, the COP will be invited to elect the President of COP 17 and CMP 7, who will serve as the President of both bodies. The COP will be invited to elect the other members of the Bureau following completion of the consultations. If any member of the Bureau represents a State that is not at that time a Party to the Kyoto Protocol at CMP 7, the CMP will be invited to elect for a term of one year a member representing a Party to the Protocol to replace such a member.

B. The officers of the subsidiary bodies established under Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention: the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI), and the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA)

5. The draft rules of procedure of the COP provide that each subsidiary body shall elect its own Vice-Chair and Rapporteur.³

6. The Kyoto Protocol provides that: "When the subsidiary bodies established by Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention exercise their functions with regard to matters concerning this Protocol, any member of the Bureaux of those subsidiary bodies representing a Party to the Convention but, at that time, not a party to this Protocol, shall be replaced by an additional member to be elected by and from amongst the Parties to this Protocol".⁴

7. Groups are invited to submit nominations for the positions of Vice-Chair and Rapporteur of the SBI and SBSTA. Following completion of consultations, the SBI and SBSTA, at their thirty-fifth sessions, will be invited to elect for a term of one year their Vice-Chair and Rapporteur, respectively.

C. The officers of the subsidiary bodies established pursuant to Article 7(2)(i) of the Convention and Article 13(4)(h) of the Kyoto Protocol: Ad hoc Working Groups under the Convention (AWG-LCA), and the Kyoto Protocol (AWG-KP)

8. The draft rules of procedure of the COP provide that unless the COP or the CMP decides otherwise, the Chair of any subsidiary body other than those established by Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention, shall be elected by that subsidiary body from among the representatives of the Parties present at the session. The Chairs, Vice-Chairs and Rapporteurs of such subsidiary bodies shall be elected with due regard to the principle of equitable geographical representation and shall not serve for more than two consecutive terms of one year.⁵

9. At its thirteenth session, the COP established the open-ended ad hoc working group

(AWG-LCA) to undertake a comprehensive process to enable the full, effective and sustained implementation of the Convention through long-term cooperative action, now, up to and beyond 2012, in order to reach an agreed outcome and adopt a decision at the fifteenth session of the COP. The COP also decided that the Chair and Vice-Chair of the AWG-LCA, with one being from an Annex I Party and the other being from a non-Annex I Party, shall alternate annually between an Annex I Party and a non-Annex I Party.⁶ At its sixteenth session, the COP decided to extend the AWG-LCA for one year, in order for it to continue its work and present the results to the COP at its seventeenth session.⁷

10. At its first session, the CMP established the open-ended ad hoc working group (AWG-KP) to consider further commitments for Parties included in Annex I for the period beyond 2012 in accordance with Article 3, paragraph 9, of the Protocol.⁸ At its sixth session, the CMP agreed that the AWG-KP shall aim to complete its work pursuant to decision 1/CMP.1 and have its results adopted by the CMP as early as possible and in time to ensure that there is no gap between the first and second commitment periods.⁹

11. The AWG-LCA and the AWG-KP are expected to present the results of their work at COP 17 and CMP 7, respectively.¹⁰ Should the COP and the CMP decide to extend the mandates of the Ad Hoc Working Groups, groups will be invited to submit nominations for the positions of Chair, Vice-Chair and Rapporteur to the AWG-LCA and/or AWG-KP for election during the sessions in Durban.

D. The Executive Board of the Clean Development Mechanism

12. The Executive Board comprises 10 members and 10 alternate members. Members and alternate members of the Executive Board are nominated by the relevant groups/constituencies and elected by the CMP. Each year, the CMP elects five members and their alternate members for a term of two years. Members and their alternates are eligible to serve a maximum of two consecutive terms. Terms as alternate members do not count.¹¹

13. At CMP 7, the CMP will be invited to elect for a term of two years five members and five alternate members to the Executive Board as follows:

- 1 member and 1 alternate member from Eastern Europe;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from SIDS;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from Parties included in Annex I to the Convention (Annex I Parties);
- 2 members and 2 alternate members from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (Non-Annex I Parties).

14. Groups/constituencies are invited to submit nominations, bearing in mind the skills and expertise required of members and alternates sitting on the Executive Board as decided in by the CMP, in particular that all members and alternate members of the Board should:

- (a) Have experience and competence in developing policy and strategy frameworks within regulatory processes, preferably but not necessarily in an international environment;
- (b) Have an understanding of business perspectives regarding investment in the environmental field;
- (c) Have knowledge on and an understanding of the intergovernmental process in relation to climate change or other environmental agreements, and an appreciation of the nexus of actions to combat climate change and promote sustainable development;
- (d) Be prepared to obtain further knowledge on and understanding of decisions of the CMP relevant to the CDM and guidance previously established by the Board;
- (e) Exhibit the highest levels of professionalism and competence and a commitment to act in their individual capacities and in a manner consistent with the Board's code of conduct;
- (f) Show commitment to the effective management of the CDM and to working as a team with other members and alternate members, including in relation to reaching consensus;
- (g) Have competence in English (written and oral).¹²

15. Parties may also wish to review the annual report of the Executive Board to CMP 4, in which the Executive Board reiterated that "its members must collectively provide the professional and regulatory competence needed to supervise the CDM, which is a mechanism of substantial size, global spread and sectoral diversity" and that members and alternate members "need to invest a considerable amount of time to provide their professional services."¹³

E. The Joint Implementation Supervisory Committee (JISC)

16. The JISC comprises 10 members and 10 alternate members. Members and alternate members of the JISC are nominated by the relevant groups/constituencies and elected by the CMP. Each year, the CMP elects five members and their alternate members for a term of two years. Members of the JISC may be eligible to serve a maximum of two consecutive terms. Terms as alternate members do not count.¹⁴

17. At CMP 7, the CMP will be invited to elect for a term of two years five members and five alternate members to the JISC as follows:

- 1 member and 1 alternate member from SIDS;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from Annex I Parties;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from Annex I Parties that are undergoing the process of transition to a market economy (Annex I EIT Parties);
- 2 members and 2 alternate members from Non-Annex I Parties.

18. Groups/constituencies are invited to submit nominations, bearing in mind that members and alternate members of the JISC shall have recognized competence relating to climate change issues and in relevant technical and policy fields,¹⁵ and the expected time commitments required of members and alternates sitting on the JISC.¹⁶

F. The Compliance Committee

19. The Compliance Committee comprises 20 members and 20 alternate members, nominated by the relevant groups/constituencies and elected by the CMP. Ten members and their alternates are elected to serve in the facilitative branch, and 10 members and their alternates are elected to serve in the enforcement branch. Every two years the CMP elects, for each branch, 5 members and 5 alternate members for a term of four years. Members shall not serve for more than two consecutive terms.¹⁷ The length of term for each member of the Compliance Committee also applies to his or her alternate member, and alternate members are not to serve for more than two consecutive terms as alternate members.¹⁸

20. When a member or alternate member resigns or is otherwise unable to complete the assigned term or to perform the functions of a member or alternate member, the Compliance Committee is to request the CMP to elect a new member or alternate member for the remainder of that member's term at its next session.¹⁹ During 2011, the secretariat received the resignation of the member nominated by the African Group and elected to serve in the facilitative branch of the Compliance Committee until CMP 9.

21. At CMP 7, the CMP will be invited to elect for a term of four years 5 members and their alternate members for each branch of the Compliance Committee, as follows:

- 1 member and 1 alternate member from Eastern Europe;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from WEOG;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from SIDS;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from Annex I Parties;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from Non-Annex I Parties.

22. The African Group is also invited to nominate a candidate to replace the member of the Compliance Committee who resigned.

23. Groups/constituencies are invited to submit nominations, including a brief curriculum vitae of each individual nominated, bearing in mind the agreed competencies of the members of the respective branches of the Compliance Committee, in particular:

- (a) That the members and alternate members of the facilitative branch shall have recognized competencies relating to climate change and in relevant fields such as the scientific, technical, socio-economic or legal fields;²⁰
- (b) That the members and alternate members of the enforcement branch shall have legal experience.²¹

24. Parties are reminded that the nature of the Compliance Committee and the particular design and function of the procedures and mechanisms require, for their effective functioning and for the quorum to be met, the availability of members and alternate members for meetings at very short notice (one to two weeks).

G. The Adaptation Fund Board

25. The Adaptation Fund Board comprises 16 members and their alternates, as follows:

- 2 members and 2 alternate members from Africa;
- 2 members and 2 alternate members from Asia-Pacific;
- 2 members and 2 alternate members from GRULAC;
- 2 members and 2 alternate members from Eastern Europe ;
- 2 members and 2 alternate members from WEOG;
- 2 members and 2 alternate members from Annex I Parties;
- 2 members and 2 alternate members from Non-Annex I Parties;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from SIDS;
- 1 member and 1 alternate member from the Least Developed Countries (LDCs).

26. The members and alternate members are identified by their respective governments, nominated by the relevant groups/constituencies and elected by the CMP. The members and alternate members serve for a term of two years and are eligible to serve a maximum of two consecutive terms.²² Terms as members do not count towards the terms as alternate members, and terms as alternate members do not count towards the terms as

members.²³ Members and alternate members of the Adaptation Fund Board shall have the appropriate technical, adaptation and/or policy expertise.²⁴

27. In accordance with decision 1/CMP.4, at CMP 7, half of the members of the Adaptation Fund Board, and their respective alternate members, shall continue to serve in office for one additional and final year - until CMP 8.²⁵

28. Groups/constituencies are invited to decide on the eight (8) members, and their alternate members from each group, who should continue to serve in office for one additional and final year until CMP 8. Groups/constituencies are also invited to submit nominations for eight (8) new members, and their alternate members, for election at CMP 7 in Durban.

H. The Consultative Group of Experts on National Communications from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (CGE)

29. At its fifteenth session, the COP decided to reconstitute the CGE for a period of three years from 2010 to 2012.²⁶ The COP also decided that the membership of the CGE shall be the same as in decision 3/CP.8, annex, paragraphs 3-8.²⁷ The COP further decided to review the term and the mandate of the CGE and the need for continuation of the group at its seventeenth session (COP 17).²⁸

30. The CGE comprises 24 experts. Twenty-one (21) members will be nominated by Parties to the Convention.²⁹ Three international organizations, with relevant experience in providing technical assistance to non-Annex I Parties in the preparation of national communications, will each be invited to nominate an expert to the CGE. The members of the CGE shall be nominated by Parties for a period of two years and shall serve a maximum of two consecutive terms. For reasons of continuity and institutional memory, two members of each regional group of the CGE shall continue to serve for a period of one year. Thereafter, new members shall be nominated to replace those who have served their terms.

31. In accordance with decision 5/CP.15, the members of the CGE were appointed for a term of two years: from 2010 to 2011. Following completion of the review of the term and mandate of the CGE by the COP, groups/constituencies will be invited to nominate 21 members to the CGE as follows:

- 5 from Africa;
- 5 from Asia-Pacific;
- 5 from GRULAC;
- 6 from Annex I Parties.

I. New bodies established by the Cancun Agreement: the Adaptation Committee, the Standing Committee and the Board of the Green Climate Fund

(a) Adaptation Committee

32. In the Cancun Agreements, the COP decided to establish an Adaptation Committee and requested the AWG-LCA, taking into account the view of Parties, to elaborate the composition of, and modalities and procedures for, the Adaptation Committee for adoption by the COP at its seventeenth session.³⁰ The AWG-LCA at the fourth part of its fourteenth session (AWG-LCA 14, part 4) in Durban will continue its consideration of the composition, and modalities and procedures for, the Adaptation Committee for, the Adaptation Committee, based on the draft decision text prepared at the third part of the fourteenth session of the AWG-LCA (AWG-LCA 14, part 3).³¹ This draft decision text contains proposals on the mandate, composition, and procedures for the work of the Adaptation Committee.

33. Should the AWG-LCA reach agreement on the mandate and composition of the Adaptation Committee, groups/constituencies represented on the Committee will be invited to submit nominations during the session in Durban.

(b) Standing Committee

34. In the Cancun Agreements, the COP decided to establish a Standing Committee under the COP.³² During AWG-LCA 14, part 4, the AWG-LCA will continue its consideration of the roles and functions, and composition and working modalities of the Standing Committee based on the Co-facilitators' draft consolidated text prepared at AWG-LCA 14, part 3.³³

35. Should the AWG-LCA reach agreement on the mandate and composition of the Standing Committee, groups/constituencies represented on the Committee will be invited to submit nominations during the session in Durban.

(c) Board of the Green Climate Fund

36. In the Cancun Agreements, the COP decided to establish the Green Climate Fund to be governed by a Board of 24 members, comprising an equal number of members from developing and developed country Parties. The COP also decided that representation from developing country Parties shall include representatives of relevant United Nations regional groupings and representatives of small island developing States and the least developed countries. The COP further decided that each Board member shall have an alternate member.³⁴ The COP requested the Transitional Committee for the design of the Green Climate Fund to develop and recommend to the

COP 17 for its approval operational documents that address, inter alia, the rules of procedure of the Green Climate Fund Board and other governance issues related to the Board.³⁵

37. Groups/constituencies will be expected to submit nominations to the Board of the Green Climate Fund should the Governing Instrument for the Green Climate Fund be approved by the COP.³⁶
