Two pre-sessional workshops held ahead of the April Climate Change Conference in Bangkok provided an important opportunity for Parties to share information on assumptions and conditions on quantified economy-wide emission reduction targets by developed countries, and to understand the diversity of nationally appropriate mitigation actions submitted by developing countries and the support needed. 
