CANCUN: A NEW ERA OF EFFECTIVE GLOBAL CLIMATE COOPERATION



"THIS GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP CAN PRESENT A MAJOR OPPORTUNITY TO DRIVE REAL ACTION ON REDD+" NAGOYA, JAPAN, 26 OCTOBER 2010

Addressing assembled Ministers at the Aichi-Nagoya Ministerial Meeting of the REDD-plus Partnership, Christiana Figueres spoke of the contribution forests in developing countries can make towards a global climate change solution and the conservation of biodiversity, and underlined the important role of the REDD+ Partnership in this regard. NEW YORK, USA, 20 SEPTEMBER 2010

In her statement to a high-level adaptation event on risk and resiliency, Christiana Figueres stressed that adapting to the adverse effects and increased risk of climate change is a necessity for all countries. She warned that recent extreme weather events are a wake-up call for the world to act – to reduce emissions quickly, to adapt to the already inevitable in order to minimize loss of life and livelihoods, and to increase resilience in order to protect our future quality of life. THE ROLE OF PATENTS IN COMBATING CLIMATE CHANGE

Six countries are the source of almost 80% of all innovations developed worldwide in the field of clean energy technologies. This is one of the key findings of a pioneering study conducted by the European Patent Office, UNEP and the International Centre for Trade and Sustainable Development, on the emergence and distribution of these technologies across the globe.



THE NEW UNEP EN.LIGHTEN INTIATIVE: SUPPORTING COUNTRIES IN THE SHIFT TOWARDS EFFICIENT LIGHTING

Lighting accounts for 19% of global electricity consumption and for about 6-8% of global GHG emissions, and global demand for electricity is expected to increase dramatically. Few actions could reduce carbon emissions as cheaply and easily as the phase-out of inefficient lighting. The en.lighten initiative is working with governments and the private sector to help countries transition to energy-efficient lighting, thus bringing new technologies to developing countries while saving energy, money and protecting the environment.
