This module on the UNFCCC website will now provide user-friendly access to data from the information submitted by developed country Parties on the resources provided in order to meet their Fast-Start Finance commitments. The AWG-LCA will resume for the fourth part of its fourteenth session in Durban,





The AWG-KP is expected to complete its work in Durban and have its results adopted by the CMP to ensure that there is no gap between the first and second commitment periods of the Kyoto Protocol. SCIENCE AND REVIEW

EVOLVING A SHARED VISION, INITIATING THE REVIEW OF THE LONG-TERM GOAL TO LIMIT GLOBAL WARMING

At COP 16 in Cancun, Parties set the long-term goal to limit global average temperature increase below 2 degrees in comparison to pre-industrial levels, and to periodically review the adequacy of this goal. At COP 17 in Durban, Parties are expected to adopt the modalities of the review, set to start in 2013 and conclude in 2015. More...

CLIMATE SCIENCE AND THE STATE OF THE CLIMATE

Record-breaking temperatures made headlines early this year, when NASA announced that 2010 tied with 2005 as the warmest year on record. The $\rm CO_2$ concentration in the atmosphere is now higher than at any time in at least 800.000 years, sea level is rising by 3.27 mm per year, and Arctic sea ice is declining by 11.5% per decade.
