CARBON MARKET, INTERNATIONAL OFFSET MECHANISMS CRITICAL IN

MEETING CLIMATE CHANGE CHALLENGE

To help countries meet their greenhouse gas emission targets under the Kyoto protocol, and to encourage the private sector and developing countries to contribute to emission reduction efforts, three market-based mechanisms were included in the Protocol – emissions trading, the clean development mechanism and joint implementation. In the following interview for this Newsletter, John Kilani, recently appointed Director of the Sustainable Development Mechanisms programme at the UNFCCC secretariat, talks about the important and expanding role of these mechanisms in tackling climate change. MITIGATION

Progress was made on a number of Mitigation issues in Accra, including on deforestation, how to enhance the Clean Development Mechanism, and on the means to reach emission reduction targets.

The link of the UNFCCC's Independent Transaction Log (ITL) with the Community International Transaction Log (CITL) scheduled for mid-October, is set to boost the exchange of global emissions credits. Linking of ITL and CITL almost complete

An update of the UNFCCC's Kyoto Protocol (KP) reference manual – a tool to assist Annex I Parties in the accounting of emissions and assigned amounts under the KP – is due for publication before the Poznań meeting. Update of Kyoto Protocol reference manual

With most Parties to the Kyoto Protocol having become eligible earlier this year to participate in the Kyoto mechanisms, the first annual submissions on a voluntary basis are now being made.

ADAPTATION

FINANCE

TECHNOLOGY

Technology was a cross-cutting issue for discussion in all three contact groups under the Ad hoc Working Group on Long-term Cooperative Action. The challenge of delivering enhanced technology cooperation and transfer for effective implementation of the Convention was highlighted.

KEY UNFCCC STATEMENTS

"PUBLIC UNDERSTANDING OF CLIMATE CHANGE CRUCIAL TO SECURING COPENHAGEN DEAL"

GENEVA, SWITZERLAND, 31 AUGUST 2008

In a speech in Geneva to mark the 20th anniversary of the IPCC, Roberto Acosta, on behalf of Yvo de Boer, stressed that public understanding of climate change plays a crucial role in securing the political commitment necessary to reach a strong agreed outcome in Copenhagen in 2009. While he praised the achievement of the IPCC in opening the world's eyes to climate



change, he emphasized that the public across the world, and the climate change process itself, need a scientific wake-up call for Copenhagen. More...

AFRICA CARBON FORUM, DAKAR, SENEGAL, 3-5 SEPTEMBER 2008

Speaking to carbon market stakeholders and government representatives at the first carbon forum to be held in Africa, Yvo de Boer pointed out that Africa was the continent hardest hit by climate change, yet benefited least from the current international climate change regime – a situation which called for concerted engagement by African leaders in the current round of



climate change negotiations. These negotiations, he said, were a chance to put in place new arrangements that would help Africa cope with the impact of climate change and spur green growth across the continent. More...

"THE AGREED OUTCOME IN COPENHAGEN 2009 NEEDS TO BE AMBITIOUS ON ALL FRONTS OF CLIMATE CHANGE ABATEMENT" POHNPEI, MICRONESIA, 12 SEPTEMBER 2008

Addressing Heads of State and Government and Ministers at the 19th meeting of the Secretariat of the Pacific Regional Environment Programme in Pohnpei, Micronesia, Yvo de Boer called on Small Island Developing States (SIDS) to be more vocal regarding their needs under an agreed outcome in Copenhagen, and to bring elaborated proposals for solutions to the negotiations. He stressed that SIDS have much to gain



under a strong agreed outcome in Copenhagen in 2009, including both mitigation support and, crucially, additional and predictable funding for adaptation. More...
