



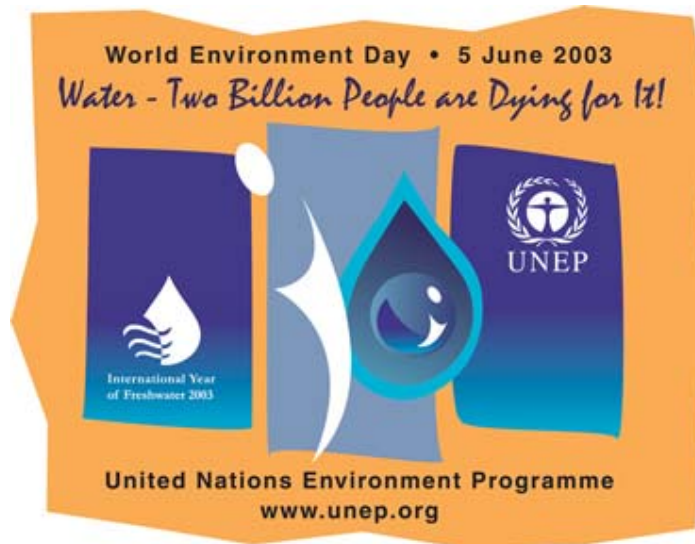

### World Environment Day



Today, 5 June, is celebrated by the United Nations as World Environment Day. The theme developed for this year by the United Nations Environment Programme is *“Water – Two Billion People are Dying For It”*. Around the world today people are focusing on the pledge made by the international community to halve the number of people who lack access to safe drinking water and basic sanitation by the year 2015 – the equivalent of establishing services for an additional 1.5 billion people over the next decade. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change has noted that many countries that are already water-stressed are likely to experience even less rainfall and greater evaporation in a world affected by climate change. Those of us working here at the climate change conference are invited to mark World Environment Day by recognizing the contribution that climate change policies can make to strengthening global efforts to supply the world’s poor with freshwater.
