- Internet access for laptop users** Internet access by telephone, wireless or network is available to participants throughout the conference. Services are available in the first floor gallery area.

  - Activate your PERSONAL FIREWALL if your computer has the software installed. WindowsXP users should activate the WINDOWS FIREWALL feature
  - Assign your computer a suitable name e.g. your organization, company or delegation.

- Security** Participants should ensure that they wear their conference badge in full view at all times, as the security officers may request them to verify their identity. This may lead to some inconvenience at times, but it is expected that participants will understand the need for such arrangements.
