## **Recommendation of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation**

The Subsidiary Body for Implementation took note of the report of the Executive Secretary on actions taken in accordance with decision 9/CMP.2 and agreed to recommend the following draft conclusions on this subject for adoption by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol at its third session:

## Draft conclusions on privileges and immunities for individuals serving on constituted bodies under the Kyoto Protocol

1. The Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP) took note with appreciation of the report of the Executive Secretary on actions taken in accordance with decision 9/CMP.2.<sup>1</sup>

2. The CMP took note of the need for an effective, legally sound and long-term solution to the issue of privileges and immunities for individuals serving on constituted bodies under the Kyoto Protocol.

3. The CMP agreed to address the issue of privileges and immunities for individuals serving on constituted bodies in the context of the second review of the Kyoto Protocol pursuant to its Article 9.
