ОБОБЩАЮЩИЙ ДОКЛАД ОБ ОСУЩЕСТВЛЕНИИ РАМОК ДЛЯ УКРЕПЛЕНИЯ ПОТЕНЦИАЛА В РАЗВИВАЮЩИХСЯ СТРАНАХ

Записка секретариата**

Резюме

Настоящий доклад был подготовлен с тем, чтобы оказать поддержку Вспомогательному органу по осуществлению в его ежегодно реализуемой деятельности по наблюдению и оценке хода осуществления рамок для укрепления потенциала в развивающихся странах, которые содержатся в приложении к решению 2/СР.7. В основу доклада положена обобщенная информация из национальных сообщений, других национальных докладов и ежегодных представлений Сторон и соответствующих организаций, которые были получены в период с сентября 2008 года по август 2009 года. Информация представляется в соответствии с элементами рамок для укрепления потенциала. Стороны, возможно, пожелают рассмотреть настоящую записку с тем, чтобы содействовать ежегодно проводимому наблюдению за ходом осуществления рамок для укрепления потенциала в развивающихся странах.

І. ВВЕДЕНИЕ

А. Манлат

- 1. В своих решениях 2/СР.7 и 4/СР.12 Конференция Сторон (КС) просила секретариат подготавливать ежегодный обобщающий доклад о деятельности по осуществлению рамок для укрепления потенциала в развивающихся странах (ниже именуются "рамки для укрепления потенциала"), используя в качестве основы информацию, содержащуюся в представлениях Сторон, национальных сообщениях, национальных программах действий по адаптации (НПДА), оценках технологических потребностей (ОТП) и самооценках национального потенциала (СОНП).
- 2. Конференция Сторон, действующая в качестве совещания Сторон Киотского протокола (КС/СС), в своих решениях 29/СМР.1 и 6/СМР.2 просила секретариат принять во внимание в его обобщающем докладе прилагаемые усилия по укреплению потенциала в связи с осуществлением Киотского протокола в развивающихся странах, используя в качестве основы информацию, содержащуюся в представлениях Сторон, докладах соответствующих многосторонних и двусторонних учреждений и частного сектора, а также информацию о деятельности Исполнительного совета Механизма чистого развития (МЧР), связанной с региональным распределением проектной деятельности МЧР, и соответствующих мерах по укреплению потенциала.
- 3. На своей двадцать девятой сессии Вспомогательный орган по осуществлению (ВОО) принял к сведению второй обобщающий доклад об осуществлении рамок для укрепления потенциала и отметил выраженную рядом Сторон озабоченность по поводу отсутствия прогресса в области осуществления рамок. ВОО также подтвердил свое предложение Сторонам делать ежегодные представления для обеспечения возможности более всеобъемлющего наблюдения за осуществлением рамок для укрепления потенциала и обмена опытом деятельности по его укреплению.

В. Сфера охвата записки

4. В третьем ежегодном обобщающем докладе подытоживается информация о деятельности по укреплению потенциала, осуществляемой в развивающихся странах, в том числе определяются потребности и пробелы, описываются приобретенный опыт и извлеченные уроки. Основное внимание в нем уделяется деятельности, которая

осуществлялась и о которой было сообщено в период с сентября 2008 года по август 2009 года.

- 5. Данная информация была заимствована из представлений Сторон и докладов о ходе деятельности, представленных Сторонами, не включенными в приложение I к Конвенции, в их национальных сообщениях, НПДА, ОТП и СОНМ. Во внимание были также приняты материалы Сторон, включенных в приложение I к Конвенции (Стороны, включеные в приложение I), которые содержатся в их национальных сообщениях, направленных согласно Киотскому протоколу, а также доклады соответствующих учреждений Организации Объединенных Наций и Исполнительного совета МЧР.
- 6. Информация представляется в соответствии с элементами рамок для укрепления потенциала. Обобщающие таблицы, включенные в приложение, могут характеризоваться некоторыми пробелами в тех областях, по которым не было представлено какой-либо информации о деятельности.

С. Возможное решение Вспомогательного органа по осуществлению

7. BOO, возможно, пожелает рассмотреть информацию, содержащуюся в настоящем документе, при проведении ежегодного наблюдения за осуществлением рамок для укрепления потенциала.

II. ОБЗОР ДЕЯТЕЛЬНОСТИ ПО УКРЕПЛЕНИЮ ПОТЕНЦИАЛА

А. Деятельность Сторон по укреплению потенциала

8. Деятельность по укреплению потенциала, отраженная Сторонами в документации, представленной в период с сентября 2008 года по август 2009 года, охватывает 15 приоритетных областей потребностей, установленных в рамках для укрепления потенциала, при этом ряд Сторон сообщают о том, что они добились значительных позитивных количественных и качественных результатов в деятельности, связанной с укреплением потенциала. Поскольку с момента представления исходных документов могла проводиться дополнительная соответствующая деятельность, подборка информации, отраженная в настоящем докладе, может не отражать полной картины достигнутого прогресса и в этой связи должна рассматриваться в качестве индикативной. Ниже приводятся примеры деятельности по укреплению потенциала, проводимой Сторонами:

- а) что касается укрепления институционального потенциала, то в ряде стран были созданы национальные координационные органы и механизмы, с тем чтобы предоставить возможности для осуществления соответствующих национальных планов действий;
- b) в рамках деятельности по улучшению и/или созданию стимулирующей обстановки были предприняты усилия для разработки или совершенствования законодательства по вопросам, касающимся изменения климата;
- с) в ряде стран подготовка национальных сообщений способствовала совершенствованию деятельности по укреплению потенциала на институциональном, правовом и техническом уровнях;
- d) в области укрепления технического потенциала были предприняты шаги по созданию механизмов для подготовки кадастров парниковых газов (ПГ), а также по наращиванию технического потенциала экспертов, занимающихся кадастрами;
- е) в настоящее время разрабатываются планы действий в отношении мер по оценке уязвимости и адаптации, включая институциональные и правовые меры, установление и оценку воздействия и учебные программы для экспертов и местных общин:
- f) началось осуществление планов действий по предотвращению изменения климата с уделением наиболее пристального внимания таким вопросам, как поощрение возобновляемых источников энергии и повышение уровня энергоэффективности;
- g) деятельность в области научных исследований и систематических наблюдений включает в себя создание учреждений для регистрации информации о климатических и природных ресурсах, принятие программ деятельности по наращиванию потенциала в области научных исследований и разработку структур систем раннего предупреждения;
- h) были предприняты шаги по замене устаревшего технологического оборудования, в особенности в секторе энергетики, в качестве примера передачи технологий;
- i) были предприняты усилия для повышения уровня информированности и осведомленности о проблемах изменения климата среди директивных органов, занимающихся осуществлением программ устойчивого развития, с тем чтобы предоставить им возможность принимать обоснованные решения;

- ј) что касается МЧР, то на национальном уровне были приняты законодательные меры с целью поощрения инвестиций в проекты МЧР и были организованы рабочие совещания для национальных учреждений, частного сектора и организаций гражданского общества с целью обмена информацией о процессе МЧР;
- к) что касается обучения, профессиональной подготовки и повышения уровня информированности, то в настоящее время на всех уровнях как в начальных школах, так и в университетах начинают осуществляться учебные программы по экологическим вопросам и проблемам изменения климата, а в рамках гражданского общества и его силами, а также в целевых общинных группах предпринимаются учебные инициативы с целью повышения уровня информированности о причинах и воздействии изменения климата, и возможных мерах реагирования. Во все большей степени используются возможности Интернета для обмена информацией о вопросах, касающихся изменения климата, и ее распространения. Целевым группам предлагается воспользоваться возможностями профессиональной подготовки по всем секторальным вопросам, связанным с изменением климата.
- 9. Инициативы по поощрению сотрудничества в усилиях, связанных с борьбой с изменением климата на региональном и субрегиональном уровнях, имели своим результатом укрепление потенциала в различных областях, таких, как: участие в процессе переговоров по РКИКООН; кадастры ПГ; организационные, правовые и технические возможности, связанные с осуществлением Конвенции; и национальные возможности для планирования и принятия мер по предотвращению изменения климата и адаптации. Учебные курсы, открытые для участников из развивающихся стран, также обеспечили полезные форумы для обмена опытом Юг-Юг и для создания сетей взаимодействия.
- 10. Касающаяся Киотского протокола деятельность по укреплению потенциала, которая предоставляет развивающимся странам возможность участвовать в проектах МЧР, включает в себя такие аспекты, как создание и укрепление назначенных национальных органов (ННО) и профессиональная подготовка их сотрудников; разработка национальных руководящих принципов по подготовке и осуществлению проектов МЧР; профессиональная подготовка в области разработки проектов МЧР, мобилизация финансовых средств и осуществление проектов и наблюдение за ходом их реализации; оценка потенциала для МЧР в странах с целью получения новейших технологий и привлечения инвестиций; установление возможных источников финансирования для вероятных проектов МЧР; и профессиональная подготовка по вопросам эффективного участия на международном углеродном рынке.

- 11. Стороны, включенные в приложение I, оказывают поддержку деятельности по укреплению потенциала в развивающихся странах на трех уровнях: индивидуальном, институциональном и системном. С учетом универсального характера изменения климата в целом и, в частности, деятельности по укреплению потенциала поддержка направлена на укрепление потенциала заинтересованных сторон (государственных учреждений, неправительственных организаций и организаций, действующих на уровне общин) для решения вопросов, касающихся изменения климата. В представлениях и докладах Сторон, включенных в приложение II, отмечается, что в интересах повышения уровня устойчивости наилучшим подходом является включение вопросов об укреплении потенциала, касающегося климата, в национальные процессы планирования развития, а не поддержка отдельных обособленных мероприятий.
- 12. Поддержка, оказываемая Сторонами, включенными в приложение I, включает в себя следующие аспекты: наращивание потенциала учреждений, занимающихся планированием и охраной окружающей среды, и укрепление соответствующих координационных механизмов; оказание финансовой поддержки для разработки национальных планов адаптации; поощрение профессиональной подготовки и обмена информацией об инструментах и методах реагирования на причины и воздействие изменения климата; поощрение сотрудничества между учеными и лицами, определяющими политический курс, в интересах повышения уровня информированности о климатических рисках; и расширение доступа к климатической информации и инструментам.

В. Резюме вопросов, затронутых в представлениях Сторон

- 13. В представлениях Сторон указывается, что деятельность по укреплению потенциала по-прежнему имеет важнейшее значение для осуществления Конвенции развивающимися странами. Ограниченный или недостаточный институциональный, научный, технический и человеческий потенциал наряду с отсутствием необходимых финансовых ресурсов затрудняет продвижение развивающихся стран и, в особенности, наименее развитых стран по пути осуществления рамок для укрепления потенциала.
- 14. Во всех представленных документах вновь подчеркивается важность рассмотрения потенциала в качестве определяемого потребностями стран процесса, который должен быть совместим с национальными приоритетами. В этом контексте подготовка НПДА и национальных сообщений является полезным средством для развивающихся стран при определении потребностей в укреплении потенциала, а также приоритетов в осуществлении сопутствующих видов деятельности.

- 15. В своих документах Стороны указывают, что, поскольку уровень осведомленности и информированности об изменении климата возрос, то стало возможным гораздо более конкретно говорить о пробелах и потребностях в различных областях, которые могут рассматриваться в контексте более целевых действий на институциональном, системном и индивидуальном уровнях.
- 16. В частности, Стороны подчеркнули необходимость наращивания потенциала в области людских ресурсов во всех приоритетных областях рамок для укрепления потенциала. Квалифицированный персонал необходим для систем образования и проведения международных переговоров, мобилизации финансовых средств и осуществления проектов по предотвращению изменения климата с целью подготовки кадастров ПГ и проведения социальных и экономических оценок вариантов уязвимости и адаптации и сопутствующих подсекторов (т.е. сельского хозяйства, водных ресурсов, лесного хозяйства, здравоохранения).
- 17. В отношении небольших стран была подчеркнута необходимость оказания поддержки на институциональном и системном уровне, а также включения вопросов, касающихся изменения климата и укрепления потенциала, в стратегии и планы действий по обеспечению устойчивого развития. Обычно указывались такие проблемы, как наличие неадекватных институциональных структур и законодательства, неэффективная координация и сотрудничество между участвующими заинтересованными сторонами и отсутствие заинтересованности в осуществляемых инициативах.
- 18. В некоторых документах подчеркивалась необходимость активизации деятельности по укреплению потенциала в области передачи технологий. Поощрение внедрения и развития технологий в ключевых секторах рассматривается в качестве приоритетной и важнейшей стратегии для успешного предотвращения изменения климата.
- 19. Повышение уровня информированности о МЧР среди учреждений и частных операторов и осуществление профессиональной подготовки по разработке и реализации проектов МЧР указывались многими Сторонами в качестве важного направления деятельности, требующего надлежащего внимания в контексте устойчивого развития.
- 20. Стороны, включенные в приложение I, стремятся получать от развивающихся стран более значительный объем информации о критериях достижения успехов, а также о том, какой вид поддержки является наиболее эффективным для укрепления потенциала. Такая информация могла бы позволить странам-донорам определять наилучшую практику в области укрепления потенциала и соответствующим образом ориентировать их поддержку. В этом контексте было бы важно контролировать и оценивать

осуществляемую странами-реципиентами деятельность по укреплению потенциала с помощью созданных национальных систем и процедур.

С. Деятельность учреждений Организации Объединенных Наций по укреплению потенциала

- 21. Области и потребности, перечисленные в рамках для укрепления потенциала, рассматриваются рядом учреждений Организации Объединенных Наций. Информация об осуществляемой деятельности кратко отражена в таблицах 1-15 в приложении, при этом каждая таблица охватывает соответствующую приоритетную область в рамках для укрепления потенциала.
- 22. При планировании и оказании поддержки в укреплении потенциала учреждения Организации Объединенных Наций обычно используют подход, учитывающий потребности стран. Деятельность на региональном и субрегиональном уровнях осуществляется на специальной основе. В частности, учреждения Организации Объединенных Наций поощряют инициативы в области сотрудничества Юг-Юг, которые способствуют установлению и укреплению широких партнерских связей между Сторонами, а также разработке, формулированию и осуществлению проектов по укреплению потенциала.
- 23. Опыт межправительственных организаций и других органов в области контроля и оценки деятельности по укреплению потенциала обсуждался в ходе проведения совещания экспертов, организованного в ноябре 2008 года секретариатом в Рио-де-Жанейро, Бразилия³.

D. Деятельность по укреплению потенциала согласно Киотскому протоколу

24. Исполнительный совет в качестве регулирующего органа МЧР продолжал принимать меры для улучшения географического распределения проектной деятельности МЧР и расширения участия различных причастных к ней субъектов. В число регулярно организовавшихся мероприятий с сентября 2008 года входят такие, как проведение Исполнительным советом МЧР на каждой сессии вспомогательных органов заседания "вопросы и ответы", открытого для всех заинтересованных участников, и проведение во время каждого совещания Исполнительного совета МЧР неофициального заседания с участием членов Совета и заинтересованных сторон.

- 25. В отчетный период были проведены два совещания Форума назначенных национальных органов (Форум ННО), который был создан с целью содействия расширению участия в МЧР и предоставления ННО возможностей для обмена мнениями и опытом. Были также проведены региональное рабочее совещание МЧР и субрегиональное совещание Форума ННО, на которых самое пристальное внимание было уделено взаимосвязям между ННО и частным сектором.
- 26. В апреле 2009 года в Бонне, Германия, для заинтересованных субъектов было организовано совместное координационное рабочее совещание с целью обмена опытом, касающимся различных аспектов процесса МЧР, и обсуждения программ деятельности МЧР, в которые в качестве отдельной программы согласно МЧР могут включаться некоторые мероприятия по сокращению выбросов ПГ, проводящиеся на протяжении определенного периода времени в рамках государственной деятельности или по инициативе частного сектора. В рамках рабочего совещания также было проведено посвященное существующим в Африке проблемам МЧР заседание, в ходе которого был сформулирован ряд рекомендаций с целью активизации участия африканских стран в работе этого механизма.
- 27. Программа Организации Объединенных Наций по окружающей среде (ЮНЕП) продолжала в сотрудничестве с секретариатом управлять порталом CDM Bazaar сетевым порталом, призванным облегчить обмен информацией между покупателями, продавцами и поставщиками услуг, участвующими в МЧР.
- 28. Еще одним важным направлением деятельности по укреплению потенциала является реализация Найробийских рамок, совместно осуществляемых секретариатом, Африканским банком развития, Конференцией Организации Объединенных Наций по торговле и развитию, Программой развития Организации Объединенных Наций, ЮНЕП, Учебным и научно-исследовательским институтом Организации Объединенных Наций и Всемирным банком. Осуществляемая в этих рамках деятельность продолжала способствовать наращиванию потенциала в рамках процесса МЧР в африканских странах с уделением первоочередного внимания оказанию помощи странам региона Африки, находящегося к югу от Сахары. В частности, Найробийские рамки активизировали свои усилия по повышению уровня заинтересованности в разработке и осуществлении проектов МЧР, укреплению потенциала ННО, с тем чтобы они стали в полной мере действующими субъектами, поощрению инвестиционных возможностей, совершенствованию пропагандистской деятельности и содействию межучрежденческому сотрудничеству.
