## Draft conclusions proposed by the Chair

- 1. The Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) took note of the synthesis report on the views submitted by Parties<sup>1</sup> prepared by the secretariat, as requested by the SBSTA at its thirty-third session.
- 2. The SBSTA agreed that the definition of forest in exhaustion (FiE) as contained in annex I of document FCCC/KP/CMP/2009/16 requires further clarification.
- 3. The SBSTA took note of Brazil's intention to organize an informal workshop, with a view to providing more clarity on the definition of FiE.
- 4. The SBSTA further agreed to continue the consideration of this matter at its thirty-sixth session.
