“Touch-to-collect” technology (Poken)

In line with the sustainability efforts for COP 22/CMP 12/CMA 1, innovative “touch-to-collect” technology (Poken) is deployed by the host country. Poken is a platform for collecting digital information and networking in a user-friendly way.

Participants can receive a personal Poken device, at no charge, at the Poken distribution counters located inside the side events and exhibits hall (Area E) and in the Moroccan Pavilion (Area D). Poken, once registered with personal login information, allows collecting digital information from the official exhibits, the side events and the Moroccan Pavilion, as well as recent secretariat’s publications and daily reports by observer organizations.

The registration of personal login information also allows an exchange of digital business cards among participants holding a personal Poken device. Once collected information is loaded on participants’ computer and the conference is over, Poken devices are no longer needed. Participants are invited to contribute to sustainability by recycling their Poken device on the last day.

Access arrangements for the opening of the first session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement and the High-Level Segment

Tuesday, 15 November 2016

Due to the strong interest among Parties and observer organizations to attend the opening of the first session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA 1) and the High-Level Segment (HLS) of the Marrakech Conference, and in order to ensure the safety and security of all participants, access to the venue of the HLS, Plenary Marrakech, will have to be limited on Tuesday 15 November.

Access to Plenary Marrakech and surrounding areas beyond Plenary Casablanca will be limited to participants with tickets or yellow badges for those Parties represented at the level of Heads of State or Government, Vice Presidents, Deputy Prime Ministers and Ministers of Foreign Affairs.

Tickets for Parties, United Nations agencies and observer IGOs, as well as the above-mentioned yellow badges, will be available for collection from the Information Desk located at the Services Area (Area I) on Saturday, 12 November from 12 noon to 7 p.m. and on Monday, 14 November from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Tickets for NGO constituencies will be distributed through the respective constituency focal points on Monday, 14 November.

Arrangements for representatives of the press and media will be communicated separately.

The tickets will be required for entering the plenary for the entire day, Tuesday, 15 November. Before entering Plenary Marrakech, the tickets will be collected by UN Security Officers. When a participant wishes to leave the room, a ticket for re-entry will be given.

Other participants are kindly requested to stay in the Side Events and Exhibits area, delegation offices and pavilions, meeting rooms and restaurants, all of which will be freely accessible. Media and UN staff will be redirected to their offices.

Plenary Casablanca as well as Meeting Rooms 4, 15, 16, 17, 24 and 30 will be available as overflow rooms to view the proceedings in Plenary Marrakech via video transmission. All other participants are invited to watch the proceedings of the HLS in these rooms where no seating arrangements will be in place. Security will direct participants to rooms with available capacity.

In addition, all TV screens throughout the conference site will show the proceedings of the HLS in Plenary Marrakech on 15 November, so that participants can follow the proceedings easily.

As another alternative, participants may prefer to watch the proceedings on one of the TV screens at the [Green Zone](#) (all participants with a badge for the Blue Zone automatically have access to the Green Zone) or via [webcast](#).

Additional measures will be put in place to ensure the safety and security of all persons present on site in emergency situations. Your cooperation is highly appreciated.
