Opening of the High Level Segment

The ceremonial opening of the first session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Paris Agreement (CMA 1) and the joint High Level Segment of COP 22/CMP 12/CMA 1, to be attended by approximately 80 Heads of State and Government, will take place in Plenary Marrakech on Tuesday, 15 November 2016,

The opening will be presided over by the President of COP 22/CMP 12/CMA 1, His Excellency Mr. Salaheddine Mezouar, in the presence of His Majesty King Mohammed VI of Morocco. The Secretary-General of the United Nations, His Excellency Mr. Ban Ki-moon, the President of the General Assembly of the United Nations, His Excellency Mr. Peter Thomson, and the Executive Secretary of the UNFCCC, Ms. Patricia Espinosa Cantellano, will also be in attendance.

A total of four seats per delegation is guaranteed behind the nameplate of each Party for the opening ceremony, two at table and two behind. Limited additional seats for holders of green badges will also be available at the back of the Plenary. Those Parties which have not collected their green badges from the Information Desk are strongly recommended to do so as soon as possible on Tuesday morning.

The opening will start after the arrival of the Heads of State/Government, Vice Presidents, Deputy Prime Ministers and Ministers of Foreign Affairs, by 12.30. Other participants are requested to take their seats by 12.00 to ensure that the opening can begin promptly.

Following the opening of the joint High Level Segment, Heads of State and Government and other Heads of Delegations will be invited to a luncheon hosted by His Excellency King Mohammed VI of Morocco at the Royal Palace. In addition, His Majesty invites 1500 participants to a lunch buffet in the Bab Ighli conference center. Please refer to [page 7](#) for more information.

National statements will be heard from Heads of State and Government upon conclusion of the luncheon. The joint High Level Segment will continue on Wednesday, 16 November and Thursday, 17 November with statements from Deputy Heads of State and Deputy Heads of Government, Ministers and other heads of delegation. Statements by inter-governmental and non-governmental organizations will be delivered in the afternoon of Thursday, 17 November. Tickets will not be required for other High Level Segment plenaries on Wednesday 16 and Thursday, 17 November.

The proceedings of 15 November can be followed on [webcast](#) and on the TV screens throughout the Conference Center, as well as in Plenary Casablanca and Meeting Rooms 4, 15, 16, 17 and 24 without restriction.

“Touch-to-collect” technology (Poken)

In line with the sustainability efforts for COP 22/CMP 12/CMA 1, innovative “touch-to-collect” technology (Poken) is deployed by the host country. Poken is a platform for collecting digital information and networking in a user-friendly way.

Participants can receive a personal Poken device, at no charge, at the Poken distribution counters located inside the side events and exhibits hall (Area E) and in the Moroccan Pavilion (Area D). Poken, once registered with personal login information, allows collecting digital information from the official exhibits, the side events and the Moroccan Pavilion, as well as recent secretariat’s publications and daily reports by observer organizations.

The registration of personal login information also allows an exchange of digital business cards among participants holding a personal Poken device. Once collected information is loaded on participants’ computer and the conference is over, Poken devices are no longer needed. Participants are invited to contribute to sustainability by recycling their Poken device on the last day.
