Information on the panel discussions during the high-level segment

The Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI), at its twentieth session, recommended that panel discussions be the mode for exchanges among ministers and other heads of delegation during the high-level segment. Four themes were also agreed.

The Bureau considered the details and format of the panel discussions among ministers and other heads of delegation. The following arrangements reflect the guidance received from the SBI and the Bureau on these matters.

The President has invited six panel members, as well as a moderator, to lead the discussion for each panel. There is a balanced representation among panel members, taking into account geographical representation and diversity of points of view.

The four panel discussions will be convened as follows:

- (1) *The Convention after 10 years: accomplishments and future challenges*
(Wednesday, 15 December 2004, from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., Plenary I)
- (2) *Impacts of climate change, adaptation measures and sustainable development*
(Thursday, 16 December 2004, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., Plenary I)
- (3) *Technology and climate change*
(Thursday, 16 December 2004, from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., Plenary I)
- (4) *Mitigation of climate change: policies and their impacts*
(Thursday, 16 December 2004, from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., Plenary II)

Connecting laptops to the Internet at COP 10

Participants with laptops may access the Internet (PlugNplay network) through two services available in the conference venue (primarily Green Pavilion). These services are available in two categories. In neither case does any change need to be made to your system.

Category #1. Loose network (nodes) cables are available in the Computer Centre for delegates and observers and in the Media Centre for journalists. To use this service, simply plug the cable into your laptop. Cables are black or yellow in colour.

Category #2. WiFi (Wireless) network services are available throughout the conference facility. To use this service, a computer equipped with a Wireless network component is needed. The wireless network is identified by the name: PlugNplay. Choose the PlugNplay point with the highest percentage of availability for better service. No changes are needed to your system to take advantage of this service. The best "hot spots" are indicated with PlugNplay banners.

Caution! The PlugNplay network is open, with no restrictions or protection. In order to ensure safe operation, please follow the best practice tips below:

1. Install and/or update your **antivirus** software.
2. Activate your **personal firewall** if your computer has such software installed. WindowsXP users should activate the **Windows firewall** feature.
3. Assign your computer a suitable name e.g. the name of your organization, company or delegation.
