Nairobi Framework

- Announced by UNSG at COP/MOP2 in November 2006
- Overall objective to do develop a comprehensive capacity building program to catalyze the CDM in Sub-Saharan Africa
- Partners: AfDB, UNDP, UNEP, UNFCCC and WB
- New partner: UN ECA

Goals of Nairobi Framework

- Build and enhance capacity of DNAs to become fully operational
- Catalyze CDM in Africa
- Promote investment opportunities for projects
- Improve information sharing/ outreach/ exchange of views on activities/ education and training
- Ensure inter-agency coordination.

- Support the CDM Executive Board in its consideration of the issue of Regional Distribution


Rationale for Joint Proposal

- Ensure optimal use of resources and ensure close coordination to avoid duplication
- Share current best practices and lessons in a coordinated way
- Address the capacity gaps not currently addressed by agencies' activities

Gaps in Capacity

- Serious lack of awareness among the policy makers and political leadership about carbon market and mitigation activities;
- No or weak focal points (DNAs) in the government in many countries
- Several technology sectors yet to be mapped to assess mitigation potential;
- Lack of institutional capacity and technical resources (e.g. local consultants and experts) to be able to develop good quality mitigation projects in a cost effective manner; and
- Need to build capacity, in the post-2012 context
 - Programmatic CDM
 - Avoided deforestation
 - Sector-specific issues
 - Low carbon economic planning.

Capacity Building Framework



Current focus is on CB for project development at the country level

Target Groups

- Policymakers in CDM-related line-ministries such as ministries of environment, energy, transportation, forestry, agriculture, etc.
- DNA staff members and members of the national CDM project approval/advisory committees functioning under the DNA.
- National experts such as local consultants, academics, and engineers from the line-ministries and government agencies such as the rural electrification authority, and the renewable energy agency.
- Prospective CDM project developers from private and public sector agencies,
- Members of the local financial and banking sector who could be interested in providing underlying financing for CDM projects in the country.

Proposed Activities

- Institutional
 - Create/Strengthen DNAs in remaining countries
 - Create Regional Hubs for CC capacity building
- Training
 - Awareness for policy makers
 - Promote sectoral champions
 - Mobilize financial sector

Proposed Activities

- Knowledge Management
 - Web-based Resource Center
 - Innovative Products and Delivery Models
- Project Development
 - Sector Assessments
 - Project Clinics
 - Regional/Global Events

Implementation Strategy

- Structured needs assessment
- Appropriate division of work based on either themes or geography
- Active involvement of local partners
- New resources to be targeted to new activities
- International Steering Committee to monitor progress
- UNFCCC Secretariat coordinates the activities

Expected Outcomes

- Institutions: Fully functional DNAs, Regional Hubs capable of providing climate change services, consultants capable of developing project documents like PINs/PDDs
- Sectoral Studies: Assessment of potential in different sectors/technologies at country level
- Project Portfolios: Different projects/programs identified and processed at national level; new methodologies developed
- Innovative Mechanisms: Delivery tools such as DL techniques, web courses developed helping in scale up of capacity building activities
- New Capacity Modules: Training materials developed in emerging topics such as pCDM, avoided deforestation, CCS, etc.

Next steps

- Support the establishment of the currently missing DNAs in Sub-S Africa
- Identify candidates for regional hubs
- Enhance participation of regional organizations (UN-ECA)
- Steering committee established
- Draft proposal circulated to donors
- Joint project proposal to be agreed in Bali
- Activity can start when funding is available
