## **GEF** and Gender Mainstreaming

- ✓ Gender equality is important for successful GEF projects and for sustainable development
  - Advances attaining of global environmental benefits and social inclusion
- √ 2011 GEF Gender Mainstreaming Policy
  - Calls on GEF Agencies to have policies, strategies, or action plans that meet 7 minimum standards:
    - 1. Institutional capacity for gender mainstreaming
    - 2. Gender elements in project design, implementation, review
    - 3. Project gender analysis
    - 4. Measures to minimize adverse impacts
    - 5. Integration of gender sensitive activities
    - 6. Monitoring and evaluation of mainstreaming progress
    - 7. Inclusion of gender experts in projects

#### **GEF-6 Core Gender Indicators**

- ✓ GEF tracks these indicators as initial steps to monitor aggregated results through projects:
  - 1. % of projects that have conducted **gender analysis** during preparation
  - % of projects that have incorporated gender responsive project results framework (e.g. gender responsive output, outcome, indicator, budget, etc)
  - 3. Share of women and men as direct beneficiaries
  - 4. Share of convention related national reports incorporated gender dimensions
  - % of monitoring and evaluation reports that incorporates gender equality/women's empowerment issues and assess results/progress



✓ Climate Mitigation Focal Area monitors these indicators, aggregated at portfolio and corporate levels

## Gender and Climate Mitigation Projects

- ✓ Improvement in gender mainstreaming reported in mitigation projects at midterm and terminal review stage: 8% in FY11, 25% in FY13, 18% in FY14
  - → Over time, projects approved after 2011 Gender Policy introduction should increase
- ✓ Renewable energy, transport, and rural electrification projects have reported positive benefits

Example: Promoting Renewable Energy Based Mini Grids for Productive Uses in Rural Areas in The Gambia




Mbolo Women Association project enhanced skills and income generation

- Expanded planned hybrid photovoltaic and wind turbine system from 1.6kW to 8.3kW.
- Hands-on courses to become renewable energy technicians
   Gambia's Renewable Energy Fund earmarked
   50% of the funding for women-led projects
- Provided support in developing appropriate proposals



# Tools & Processes to Strengthen Gender Responsiveness



- ✓ Gender analysis or socio-economic assessment with gender focus at outset of project preparation
- ✓ Development and implementation of project specific gender strategy/plan
- ✓ Having gender balance in project implementation team and women's group as project partner

# Ethiopian Urban NAMA: Creating Opportunities for Municipalities to Produce and Operationalize Solid waste Transformation (COMPOST)

- ➤ Ethiopia has developed a Micro and Small Enterprises Development Strategy (MSEDS) that aims to create large numbers of jobs and to develop an attitude of entrepreneurship among the youth and women.
- Project will support women to have an active role in integrated solid waste management and urban green infrastructure development and implementation.

#### Improving Mobility in Parakou, Benin

- > Seeks to enhance the well-being of women by:
  - Including them in training and knowledge sharing to improve two wheel service and value chains, enabling them to diversify income sources
  - Providing improved access to social services
  - Improving mobility for women who ride two wheelers, which constitute the large majority of two-wheeled taxis and motorbike riders
