Background

• SBSTA 39 (November 2013):

- Requested the secretariat to make the materials available by electronic means for the experts participating in reviews in 2014.
- Develop a formal training programme for consideration at SBSTA 40.

1st LR meeting (April 2014):

- ➤ LRs noted the need to **formalize current training materials** developed by the secretariat in a training programme for **consideration of SBSTA 40**.
- Addressing the training needs of new and experienced experts.
- Including an assessment of their qualifications, to ensure necessary competence for their participation in ERTs for the reviews of BRs and NCs.

• SBSTA 40 (June 2014):

- Requested the secretariat to make available in the second half of 2014, on a trial basis, online courses for experts participating in reviews.
- Courses available on a trial basis until the training programme is adopted at COP 20.



Background

• SBSTA 41 and COP 20 (December 2014):

Requests the secretariat to develop and implement the "Training programme for review experts for the technical review of biennial reports and national communications of Parties included in Annex I to the Convention", including the examination of experts.

2nd LR meeting (March 2015):

- ➤ LRs noted the scope and focus of the courses and the examination requirements, which new review experts and LRs must pass in accordance with the requirements.
- The LRs considered that experienced review experts and LRs should acquire the new practical skills and knowledge for reviews provided in the training courses.
- The LRs noted that experienced review experts would benefit from taking the general and cross-cutting course and its examination, and courses and examinations of their expertise.
- The LRs strongly encouraged these experts to undertake the indicated courses.



Details:

- Courses intended to train review experts for the technical review of biennial reports and national communications of Annex I Parties.
- ➤ All training courses will be available online through the Internet and upon request, available to trainees all year round, without facilitation by instructors.
- For trainees without easy access to Internet courses will be distributed electronically.
- At the request of any Party, the training courses will also be made available to others interested in the review process.



Examinations:

- All training courses will **include an examination** and its procedures will be standardized, objective and transparent.
- The examination will take place online.
- In exceptional circumstances, other arrangements for examinations will be made, provided that examinations take place under supervision of the secretariat and that this does not require additional resources.
- Experts who do not pass an examination at the first attempt may retake the examination once only, provided that the expert fulfilled all of the tasks assigned in a timely manner and that this does not require additional costs.
- New experts who successfully complete the training programme and pass the examinations will be invited to participate in a centralized or in-country review, working with experienced review experts.



- Courses of the training programme:
- 1. General and cross-cutting aspects of the review of national communications and biennial reports:

Target audience: New review experts and lead reviewers.

Examination requirements: New review experts and **lead reviewers must pass** the examination. Online examination.

2. Technical review of targets and of policies and measures, their effects and their contribution to achieving those targets:

Target audience: New review experts reviewing targets and PaMs and LRs. **Examination requirements**: New review experts **must pass the examination**. Online examination.



3. Technical review of GHG emissions, emission trends, projections and the total effect of PaMs:

Target audience: New review experts reviewing emission trends, projections and the total effect of PaMs, and lead reviewers.

Examination requirements: New review experts **must pass the examination**. Online examination.

4. Technical review of the provision of financial support, technology transfer and capacity-building:

Target audience: New review experts reviewing the provision of financial support, technology transfer and capacity-building, and lead reviewers.

Examination requirements: New review experts must pass the examination. Online examination.



Training activities in 2014 – 2016: Milestones

First and second round of BRs and NCs reviews in 2014:

- > Training materials offered in electronic format in the VTR covering the four courses of the training programme.
- ➤ 147 reviewers (73 from non-Annex I Parties and 74 from Annex I Parties) had access.

Third round of reviews of BRs and NCs in 2015:

➤ Online training materials and examinations offered in an e-learning format covering the four courses of the training programme (pilot training for 3 ERTs: March – April 2015).

Reviews of BR2s in 2016:

- ➤ Online training materials and examinations offered in two rounds covering four courses of the training programme (all experts: September 2015 and January February 2016).
- ☐ Online training materials and examinations will be offered covering four courses of the training programme (all experts: second half of 2016).
- ✓ There are financial constrains for offering the courses more often and without limited study periods



Training activities in 2015 - 2016: Results

Contacted approximately 460 experts. Participated 59 % (271 experts).

- First round (March April 2015):
 - Participated 13 experts.
 - ➤ 11 passed one or more examinations.
- Second round (September 2015):
 - Participated 173 experts.
 - 114 passed one or more examinations.
- Third round (January February 2016):
 - Participated 85 experts.
 - 76 passed one or more examinations.
 - > TOTAL: 201 experts passed one or more examinations (74.2 %).
 - ➤ Of 74 LRs, 38 passed the mandatory exam on "General and cross-cutting aspects of the review of BRs and NCs" (51.4 %).



Training activities in 2015 – 2016: Results

Experts passed the exams	177	146	135

Feedback from experts, both new and experienced: POSITIVE

- Focus on the reporting and review requirements
- Examples from published review reports
- Exercises for drafting findings and report



Points for consideration

- Welcome the information on training activities in 2015 and 2016.
- Note the scope and focus of the training courses and the examination requirements.
- Note that training materials helped to enhance knowledge on substantive matters and approaches for review, and facilitated a consistent approach in reviews across Parties.
- Consider that **experienced experts and LRs should enhance their expertise** by acquiring new practical skills and knowledge **provided in training courses**.
- Reiterate that experienced experts will benefit from taking the general and cross-cutting course and examination, as well as courses and examinations related to their expertise.
- Recommend/strongly reiterate encouragement that experienced experts and in particular LRs undertake the relevant courses and pass the relevant examinations.
