## Climate Action for Zero Hunger

### Overall Narrative

SDG2 establishes a clear linkage between ending hunger and malnutrition, and promoting sustainable agriculture. It aims to improve the livelihoods and resilience of the world's more than 500 million family farmers, fishers, indigenous communities and pastoralists at the centre of the action frame. To achieve this vision, the rural poor must be recognized as agents of change in promoting the agricultural and rural transformation that is needed to end hunger and adapt to and combat climate change. A key theme of the event is to address hunger, poverty and climate change in conjunction. The thematic roundtables recognize challenges to achieving food security and nutrition, and identify strategies, policies, programs, platforms and investments to build resilient, inclusive and productive food systems for improved nutrition. The roundtables will provide examples demonstrating how SDG2 can be addressed through adaptation, resilience and risk-reduction responses that minimise climate change.
