

# Objective of the NWP

- Assist all Parties, in particular developing countries, including LDCs and SIDS
  - to improve their understanding and assessment of impacts, vulnerability and adaptation
  - to make informed decisions on practical adaptation actions



# Expected outcomes of the NWP

- Enhanced capacity for V&A assessment
- Enhanced development, dissemination and use of knowledge from practical adaptation activities
- Improved information and advice to COP and
- Enhanced <u>cooperation</u> among <u>Parties</u>, relevant organizations, business, civil society, and decision makers
- Enhanced integration of actions to adapt to climate change with sustainable development

Data and observations Methods and tools Climate modelling, scenarios and downscaling Socio-economic information Research

#### Climate related risks and extreme events

Adaptation planning and practices Technologies for adaptation Economic diversification



## Distinctive features of the Nairobi work programme

- o Implementation "outside" the SBSTA negotiations with regular reports to the SBSTA and review in 2008 and
- o Implementation through both specific actions, and catalysing adaptation actions by others
- o Specific actions (workshops, papers) are  $\underline{\text{the tools}}$  rather than a end-products of NWP
- o Involving both Parties and a broad range of stakeholders (organisations, business, civil society, practitioners)
- o Wide and "tailored" distributing of deliverables
- o Addressing all parties while recognising most vulnerable



## Actors and responsibilities

- - Submissions under focus areas
  - Participation in workshops and expert meetings
  - Sharing experience and tools
- Relevant organizations&institutions
  - Submissions and participation in workshops and meetings
  - SBSTA urged organizations and stakeholders to undertake their own activities in support of the objective and themes and to share the outcomes with the SBSTA
- UNFCCC Secretariat
  - · Synthesis and workshops/expert meetings reports, progress reports on implementation
  - Engagement of a wide range of organizations, institutions, experts and communities
  - Wide dissemination of deliverables of the NWP to relevant stakeholders -beyond UNFCCC BAU practice by all effective means and "tailored" to specific users
- SBSTA&UNFCCC
  - Coordinating implementation, monitoring progress, reviewing, identifying further actions, forwarding results to SBI
  - Catalysing actions by others



## How NWP can catalyse activities on adaptation?

- Enhancing <u>flow of technical information</u> to feed to the implementation process under SBI/COP
- Enhancing information transfer between <u>climate change and</u>
  other <u>communities</u> through involving a <u>broad range of</u>
  <u>organizations</u> and their respective networks, including sectoral
  and disaster risk reduction and management communities, NGOs
  on community based adaptation.
- Involving <u>national actors</u> in policy areas that are most relevant to adaptation action (e.g. sectoral authorities, including financial ministers, planners, decision makers)
- Facilitating <u>dialogue</u> between scientific&technical and policy community, promoting <u>development of adequate methodologies</u> for assessment and practical adaptation



## **NWP Work so far**

- Submissions from Patties and organizations:
  - Climate related risks and extreme events May
  - Adaptation planning and practices- May
  - Methods and tools- May
  - On four more NWP areas by August and September
- · Workshops, meetings
  - Climate related risks and extreme events June, Cairo
  - Adaptation planning and practices -September, Rome
  - Methods and tools early 2008, TBD
- Involvement of organisations Action pledges
- Dissemination creating warehousing, preparing for distribution of information/tools/research to relevant stakeholders
