# Support provided through national and regional projects



“(a) to **reduce vulnerability** to the impacts of climate change, by building adaptive capacity and resilience; [and]  
(b) to facilitate the **integration of climate change adaptation**, in a coherent manner, into relevant new and existing policies, programmes and activities, in particular development planning processes and strategies, within all relevant sectors and at different levels, as appropriate” (decision 5/CP.17).

# Samoa: Economy-wide Integration of CCA and DRM/DRR to Reduce Climate Vulnerability of Communities

UNDP, \$13.65M from the LDCF, approved in July 2013

- **stocktaking** of all current and planned climate change adaptation projects, plans, reports and assessments;
- establishing a national **climate and disaster risk database** that is centralized and accessible to all Ministries;
- **integrating medium and long-term climate change risks** and opportunities into sector plans; and
- developing concrete **recommendations to align the next Strategy for the Development of Samoa (2017-2021) with the draft National Climate Change Adaptation Strategy** and recommendations for sector plans

# Djibouti: Supporting rural community adaptation to climate change in mountain regions

UNDP, \$6M from the LDCF, endorsed in August 2014

- reactivating of the **National Climate Change Committee** and provision of secretariat services to coordinate adaptation responses to climate change
- developing a **National Climate Change Strategy**, informed by dynamic modelling for quantified scenario analysis of adaptation options which promote a Climate Change-Resilient Economy

# Antigua and Barbuda: Building climate resilience through innovative financing mechanisms for climate change adaptation

UNEP, \$5.58 million from the SCCF, approved in Nov 2013

- **Policy briefs and technical guidelines** developed for policy makers on adaptation – including cost-effective adaptation interventions focused on ecosystems – funded by innovative financing mechanisms.
- **Existing policies and plans revised** to promote and facilitate adaptation to climate change by using innovative financing mechanisms



# Namibia: Scaling up community resilience to climate variability and climate change in Northern Namibia, with a special focus on women and children

UNDP, \$3.50M from the SCCF

- **mainstreaming climate change into national agricultural strategy/sector policy**, including adjustments to budgets for replication and up-scaling
