Key aspects of the NAP-GSP support




Builds on efforts underway from the National Adaptation Programme of Action (NAPA) – which address urgent and immediate priorities for adaptation



Focusses on the need for countries to initiate steps to identify, finance and implement appropriate medium- to long-term adaptation needs



Balances sectoral and cross-sectoral priorities, at national, sub-national and local levels.



Analyzes appropriate data



Considers the country's experiences and good practices. Encourages knowledge sharing and learns from other countries' experiences.



Responds to the invitation made by the UNFCC Parties in Durban, Doha and Warsaw to the UN Agencies and other organizations to provide support including through support programs

























What does the NAP-GSP do?

Activities commenced in June 2013

Programme Objective: "To strengthen institutional and technical capacities for iterative development of comprehensive NAPs"



Supports requesting countries with oneon-one technical assistance on demand to get started on the NAP process



Provides tools and training to support key steps of the NAP process through regional training



Facilitates exchange of lessons and knowledge through South-South and North-South cooperation























Lessons learnt and experiences – initial reflections

- Adaptation and NAP itself is not a one-time activity;
 - requires ongoing action;
 - learning plays a key role and needs to be built in to the NAP process
- There is guidance on doing NAP's (LEG guidelines, supplements) - HOW
 - No clarity about WHAT is likely to come out at the end of a NAP process?

















Lessons learnt and experiences – initial NAP-GSP reflections

- A set of effective institutional response mechanism
 /arrangements must be one of the outcomes of a 'NAP process' which should include:
 - Policy, legislation, inter-ministerial coordination, finance, knowledge, science, capacity utilization, stakeholder engagement, monitoring.
- There is need for tailored support countries come from different locations and different baselines
 - and the process itself is about developing <u>a model</u> that is appropriate given the national circumstances and the political economy
- NAP document is another outcome.
 - NAP document is an important document that informs the NAP process.

















Lessons learnt and experiences – initial NAP-GSP reflections

- Partnerships with organizations are key to supporting countries for the NAP
- Planning doesn't happen in a vacuum—NAP is a political economy issue
 - Environment ministries in association with sector ministries, planning and finance
- The connection between the NAPA, National Communication and the NAP process is significant
- Countries eager to move from planning to implementation
