

Linkages between the Technology Mechanism and the GEF

Technology Development and Transfer at the GEF

- Recognition that technology is a critical enabler to support the achievement of the objectives of the Convention and the goals of the Paris Agreement
- Technology has been a cross-cutting priority at the GEF since its inception
- Innovation, technology development and transfer continue to be at the core of the GEF-8 Programming Directions
 - Innovation Window over 12 Mio USD
 - Global Green Hydrogen Program (approved at C66, 15 mio USD of GEF resources, high interest => addendum being developed)
- Continued support for TNAs

Existing Linkages between the GEF and the TM – Programming and Support 1/2

- Provision of predictable non-reimbursable funds for climate action, including to a large extent for technology related activities:
 - provision of financial resources for **implementation** of technology-related climate action, specifically projects that recipient countries may elect to develop or execute with support/advice from the TEC or CTCN.

Financing of TNAs:

• **GEF has supported TNAs** through subsequent Phases of its Global TNA Project. It now covers **over 95 developing countries with more than US\$28 million**, implemented in five phases. Phase V of the GTP was approved by the GEF a year ago, and includes 17 participating countries, 12 of which are updating their previous GEF-funded TNAs.

Existing Linkages between the GEF and the TM – Programming and Support 2/2

- Linkages to programming and mainstreaming:
 - in its project reviews, GEF Secretariat considers existing TNAs in host countries, and discusses with proponents whether TNA results have been taken into consideration and how/why not.
- Support for capacity building and coordination between TM and FM focal points:
 - The GEF supports capacity building activities as integral components
 of its project financing and through its Country Engagement Strategy.
 NDEs of the Technology Mechanism are invited to participate to GEF
 National Dialogues, to facilitate further coordination with GEF OFPs
 and to explore potential cooperation at national level, in a country driven manner.
