	The first round of the international assessment and review (IAR) process has been successfully completed owing to joint efforts of the review experts, the Parties and the secretariat. Experience and lessons learnt from this round of IAR includes the need for stronger reviewers' engagement, improvements in the review process and more substantive guidance on the review.
	Approach to the second round of international assessment and review 2016-2017 Ruta Bubniene, MDA, UNFCCC secretariat
	BR2s of 44 Annex I Parties will be reviewed at centralized reviews in March – June 2016, involving about 115 experts. The review will be followed by 2 multilateral assessment sessions at SBI 45 (December 2016) and SBI 46 (May 2017). Early preparation for the review cycle, enhanced existing tools, developed new tools and streamlined approaches will ensure effective coordination of the reviews and timely completion of the reports.
	Training for biennial reports and national communications reviewers Javier Hanna, MDA, UNFCCC secretariat
	In April 2015 the secretariat successfully implemented the on-line training programme of experts for the review of BRs and NCs. To date 271 experts participated in the training programme, 13 in April 2015, 173 in September2015 and 85 in January 2016. Of these, 203 experts passed one or more examinations. Training materials helped review experts to enhance their knowledge of substantive matters and their common understanding of the review steps, with a view to facilitating a consistent approach in the reviews across Parties.

The RPG is meant to be "living" tool facilitating the consistency among the reviews and across the review cycles and reflecting collective, cumulative NC and BR review practices. The RPG is meant to be updated after each review cycle, considered by the LRs at the LRs meetings and recommended to be used by the ERTs in future reviews.
