# 2016

- SBI44 in May agreed on the draft of the revised reporting guidelines, except for the bracketed text in paragraph 71 (as contained in FCCC/SBI/2016/8, pp.35- 67, http://unfccc.int/resource/docs/2016/sbi/eng/08.pdf);
- SBI45 in November agreed to continue its consideration of the outstanding issue in paragraph 71 at SBI 46 (May 2017);
- Some Parties expressed their intention, at the SBI 45 plenary, to use the draft revised guidelines for their submission of NC7 due on 1 January 2018.

# 2017

- SBI 46 and 47 (May and November 2017) will continue consideration of paragraph 71;
- Aiming for the adoption at COP23 (November 2017).

No change to "shall", "should" and "may", basically.



Built on the experience of NC/BR reporting
