


# Introduction and background



#### The Nairobi Work Programme

Advancing adaptation action through knowledge









- Convenes 300 + non state actors (~ national, regional and international organizations, centres and networks, diverse disciplines, countries and regions)
- Provides "recognition" for these actors to "share" their experience in response to Parties' needs
- Builds collaborative communities of practice through years of cultivated partnerships
- Catalyzes actions by NWP partners to support the work of the AC, the LEG
- Emerging activities: strengthening existing and developing new partnerships with subnational governments, research and scientific communities (including IPCC), private sector, etc.





- Capturing and synthesizing the latest information and knowledge
- ❖ Recent work on linking national and local adaptation planning; areas addressing water resources, human health, ecosystems and settlements, and cross-cutting issues such as gender, local, indigenous and traditional knowledge
- Emerging activities on indicators of adaptation and resilience at the national/local levels, economic diversification, health, human settlements, ecosystems and water resources.





- Increasingly responsive to address adaptation knowledge gaps (e.g. Lima Adaptation Knowledge Initiative (LAKI))
- ❖ Targeted "partnerships" with regional centres and networks and global institutions (e.g. emerging activities in undertaking/disseminating knowledgesharing and training activities)
- Emerging activities to foster collaboration among policymakers, research and scientific communities, practitioners and financial institutions to close adaptation knowledge gaps at national/sub national levels.





- ❖ Fosters learning through knowledge exchange and boosts adaptation actions at all levels (e.g. annual focal point forums; technical workshops, informal brainstorming meetings)
- Adaptation Knowledge Portal provides an online platform to facilitate global dissemination of knowledge on adaptation
- ❖ Emerging activities include enhancing participation of UNFCCC national focal points in disseminating knowledge outputs generated under the NWP to countries; communicating with partners and relevant organizations, including through webinars, in collaboration with the AC and the LEG, on the process to formulate and implement NAPs.
