I: Introduction and background

- ❖ Decision 1/CP.21, para 42: AC requested to consider methodologies for assessing adaptation needs with a view to assisting developing country Parties, without placing an undue burden on them and to provide recommendations for CMA1
- ❖ AC10 considered a desk review of existing methodologies for adaptation needs assessments and agreed to:
 - Issue a call for submissions
 - Organize a small expert meeting
- ❖ This paper, taking into account the submissions and the desk review, presents elements for developing recommendations based on the analysis of gaps and challenges of existing methodologies



II: Summary – Gaps and challenges

Existing methodologies

- Wide range of methodologies have been developed and applied to assess needs for adaptation action
- ➤ However work on assessing the needs for support is still at an early stage
- Methodologies facilitating the estimation of indicators and metrics that can be measured, aggregated and compared for adaptation support needs are lacking



II: Summary - Elements for recommendations

- Proposing guiding principles underlying the consideration of methodologies (relevance, flexibility and practicality)
- ❖ Reporting on gaps and challenges, e.g. related to accessibility, capacity, coverage, data and essential information)
- Inviting action to advance methodologies:
 - Open call to all relevant entities to address the gaps and challenges
 - > Invite specific entities to address particular challenges, e.g.
 - Improving the accessibility of existing methodologies (NWP)
 - Refining existing methodologies (IPCC)
 - Filling in the data and information gaps (WMO, GFCS)
 - Addressing the capacity challenge (PCCB)
 - Developing new methodologies (Research community etc.)
