Thank you Co-Chairs

My name is Asad Rehman from Friends of the Earth EWNI a member of Climate Justice Now!

Chair, we seek an outcome that provides a just transformation to clean energy, that secures the right to food and that responds to the loss and damage of the poorest caused by the richest.

We believe that Work Stream 2 must therefore drastically scale up developed country pledges to bring them in line with the science and their fair share of global effort - and scale up the provision of finance and technology so we can see the transformation happen in our communities.

In Warsaw we must agree concrete measures such as a global feed in tariff, energy efficiency, an end to producer subsidies to dirty energy corporations and steps towards a ban on new dirty energy projects.

in Work Stream 1, we must build on what we have, a comprehensive outcome under the Convention that addresses all intersected elements of the climate crisis and that shares efforts fairly.

we know how to do this.

Chair we do it based on historical responsibility, acknowledging capability, and providing for equitable access to sustainable development.

Using indicators such as historical emissions per capita and gdp per capita - it is clear that the majority of global effort must be borne in the north.

this effort will include binding emission reduction targets on a scale to meet the planetary emergency as well as the transfer of the means of implementation to secure a truly radical transformation in the south.

Chair, every country must be bound to their fair share of the remaining carbon budget, differentiated by historical responsibility and respective capabilities

Chair we will not accept the US's pledge and review system - it is a polluters charter for elites and corporations.
