















#### **Youth Climate Action Awards Ceremony**

"Showcasing the power of young people as key players in reaching innovative and ambitious solutions to combat climate change"

#### Thursday, 16 November 2017, 17:45 - 18:45 Main Stage, Bonn Zone



This special award ceremony at the UN Climate Change Conference (COP 23), organized in partnership with the UNDP GEF-Small Grants Programme, Connect4Climate and Television for the Environment (tve), will screen the winning videos and present the awards of the Global Youth Video Competition on Climate Change, showcasing the power of young people as key players in reaching innovative and ambitious solutions to combat climate change. In addition, the focal points of the Youth Constituency (YOUNGO) and Conference of Youth (COY 13) will be awarded for their climate leadership.

This year, videos were submitted under the categories 'Climate friendly and resilient cites' and 'Oceans and climate change'. Out of 247 videos submitted from 94 countries, two young climate leaders were selected as the winners of the 2017 Global Youth Video Competition on Climate Change.

- Mr. Younes Lamsaoui is the winner of the 'Climate friendly and resilient cities' category. The video "Turning green" highlights how Marrakesh, the "red city", is responding to the challenges of climate change and how he is contributing to this transition. As a young primary school teacher, he is educating the next generation on how to help make their city greener and live sustainable.
- Mr. Adarsh Prathap is the winner of the 'Oceans and climate change' category. The video "Let mangroves recover" underlines the importance of mangroves and shows how their preservation can save thousands of lives. His video, concluding with "sometimes nature is the only answer", sends a strong message on the significance of this ecosystem for the region for saving its vulnerable coastline.
