Context

- Implementation of the future global climate change regime creates unprecedented needs and opportunities for awareness raising, training, and skills development
- One UN Side events in Poznan revealed opportunities for sharing experience and scaling up CC training in the UN system
- Concept note for a One UN Training Service Platform developed through collaboration of UNITAR, UNDP, UNEP, UNFCCC, CEB Secretariat and UNSSC
- UN CC:Learn complements CC:Inet by focusing on services available through UN organizations and their operational activities
- UN CC:Learn is at the disposal of UN agencies and Member states


Objectives of UN CC:Learn

- Provide a one-stop window for accessing and sharing information on climate change training materials and activities of UN agencies
- Foster development of One UN Climate Change Training Package
- Support national processes to strengthen human resource and skills development for climate change through One UN cooperation
- Facilitate knowledge sharing on the design, delivery and evaluation of climate change training of UN agencies

UN CC:Learn Principles

- Build on, and provide value-added to existing national climate change processes and related country and UN project with a focus on training and skills development
- One UN collaboration operating within the CEB-facilitated UN Climate Change framework
- Facilitate input and ensure ownership of UN agencies and countries
- Ensure close linkages with the UNFCCC process and UNFCCC Secretariat (Capacity Development Framework, CC:Inet, etc)

- Searchable Inventory of UN Learning and Training Resources
- Information on UN-supported climate change training activities
- Sharing of experiences of good training practices

2. Development of One UN Climate Change Training Package


- Core UN Learning Materials
- Thematic Learning Kits (cc science, cc and health, etc)


3. Country Pilot Projects to Strengthen Human Resource and Skills Development on Climate Change

- Identifying elements of a One UN Climate Change Training Package
- Side Event on UN CC:Learn at the Bonn climate change talks in June 2009
- Steering Group Workshop, 29-30 October 2009
- Presence in at Copenhagen Conference through exhibition
- Development of guidance methodology to support country-driven human resource and skills development on climate change
- One-Country-One UN pilot workshops in 2010-2011






Implementation
