

Sustainable Landscape Goals


SL funding priority: working in land uses that are most significant sources of emissions or represent the greatest opportunity for sequestration in the country or region

USAID prioritizes work with partner countries with:

- globally important forest landscapes
- high demonstration potential
- commitments to developing monitoring, reporting, and verification systems, and enabling policy structures such as land and resource tenure.

Engendering Utilities Program

Program Scope- Increase the economic participation of women in Electrical Distribution Companies (DISCOs)

- Phase I- Data Collection & Analysis
- Key Findings
 - -Women comprised 13% of workforce in sampled utilities
 - -Women held top leadership positions
 - Women not benefiting from internship or training opportunities
- Phase II- Implementation





Power Africa

- 12 USG Agencies
- 100+ Private Sector and Civil Society Partners
- Goal: To double electricity access in sub-Saharan Africa
 - Off-Grid Energy Challenge
 - Lighting Africa
