- b)key actors: subnational (regional, cities, decentralized) governments, NGOs, engineers and planners, experts on specific topics (medical, etc), indigenous people, women, private sectors, schools, colleges and universities, media, youth organizations, research, vulnerable groups, climate services in both public and private sectors, faith communities.
- d)What is need to address: lack of support, lack of coordination through personal interaction, public outreach, and data (in terms of both collection and sharing of this data), lack of access to information, lack of expertise, participation to innovation and research, translation and simplification of information.
- f) Next steps (suggestions or a way forward): Assessment for subnational governments, network development, training, financial support, local enforcement, bring research and data availability to communities, social behavior changes, coherence with national, learning partnerships, filter messages into the grassroots communities and vice versa (from the grassroots to the top), knowledge exchange, representation of indigenous communities in subnational governments, simplification and availability of information, translation support, monitoring..twinning, law or legislation for disclosure of information,
