#### Objective of proposed approach

Article 14 of the Paris Agreement provides for a periodic global stocktake "of the implementation of this Agreement to assess the collective progress towards achieving the purpose of this Agreement and its long-term goals." This stocktake should be done in a "comprehensive and facilitative manner, considering mitigation, adaptation and the means of implementation and support, and in the light of equity and the best available science".

#### Guiding Features

- Separation of technical assessment process from political decision-making process
  - Produce a factual report from the technical assessment
- Focused attention and adequate time given to each of the thematic areas in the Paris Agreement, with numerous sources of information for each
- Involvement of wide range of stakeholders
- Open, face-to-face dialogue
- Balanced approach Chairing, content, consideration of thematic areas
- Flexible and practical operational modalities


Technical Dialogue

- Oversight of process
- Guidance to Technical Dialogue
- Receive report from Technical Dialogue
- Make recommendations to CMA/Ministers
- 2 co-facilitators from developed and developing countries
- Develop guiding questions
- Organise thematic events
- Decide on modalities as appropriate e.g.
   sourcing inputs, roundtable, workshop, expert input
- Prepare factual reports

#### Operationalisation of the Phased Approach – Key Characteristics

#### Information Gathering and Compilation

- Preparation of guiding questions by co-facilitators
- Call for inputs from relevant sources ahead of the event
- Transparency framework, submissions, technical papers, synthesis reports, expert analysis
- Compilation of inputs


#### Consideration of inputs/assessments

- Presentations and face-to-face discussions in relevant modalities e.g. roundtables, workshops
- Opportunity could be provided for addressing identified gaps and for updating at later events

#### Preparation and Consideration of Outcomes

- Preparation of report from each event by co-facilitators
- Preparation of factual synthesis report by co-facilitators
- JCG consideration of synthesis report at the end of the process ... goes to CMA for political consideration
- Political inputs, including ministerial event
