## Why trade matters

Trade is an engine for growth, and with the right flanking measures it serves to support social and economic development.

Distortions or restrictions to trade can hamper its contributions to sustainable development.



### Using trade policy to achieve climaterelated goals

Mitigation requires major changes in production and consumption, as well as in global movement of goods and services.

Trade measures are, *in principal,* intended to reduce GHG emissions... however they may, *in practice,* constitute a disguised restriction to trade.

Unilateral and other measures to mitigate CC could adversely impact trade and economic development.





Response measures that may impact social and economic development:

- Border carbon adjustment measures
- Free allowances in ETS
- Standards and labeling
- Subsidies for Energy, Agriculture, etc
- Taxes on maritime/aviation transport
