Launched by South Africa, the Republic of Korea and Germany at the Petersberg Climate Dialogue in 2010, the International Partnership on Mitigation and MRV encourages all countries to step up mitigation ambition and carry out the transformation towards a sustainable low-carbon society.

The Partnership seeks to:

- › improve and increase the visibility of mitigation-related strategies and actions that contribute to closing the global ambition gap;
- › foster transparency, communication and networking between different alliances in the UN climate negotiations;
- › promote a mutual learning process through the exchange of good practice on INDCs, LEDS, NAMAs and MRV;
- › strengthen mutual understanding between different alliances in the UN climate negotiations.

The Partnership facilitates an exchange between climate negotiators, policymakers and practitioners from more than 70 developing and developed countries.

Partnership formats include:

- › meetings held in the margins of UN climate negotiations;
- › capacity building activities such as peer-to-peer learning, and technical workshops through Regional Groups in Africa, South-East Asia, and Latin America and the Caribbean's, and international in depth workshops;
- › knowledge sharing and knowledge products on INDCs, MRV, NAMAs, and LEDS.
