By 2050, half the world's population will live in cities, which create around 70% of all carbon emissions and consume around 70% of all resources. But cities are also vibrant hubs of knowledge that can launch innovative solutions and trends to help solve these problems, like clean energy or transport.

For example, Morocco aims to source more than half its energy from renewable sources by 2030. This will help cut the country's greenhouse gas emissions by a third. Hotels are among the many businesses that are proudly switching to clean energy. So, by making informed decisions about accommodation - or any other goods and services you spend money on - you can help Morocco to hit those targets.

With the right choices, the journey we are starting together in Marrakech can inspire even more sustainable voyages of discovery across Morocco, the African continent and the rest of the world; making sure the next generation can do the same.

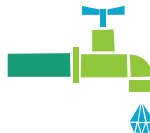

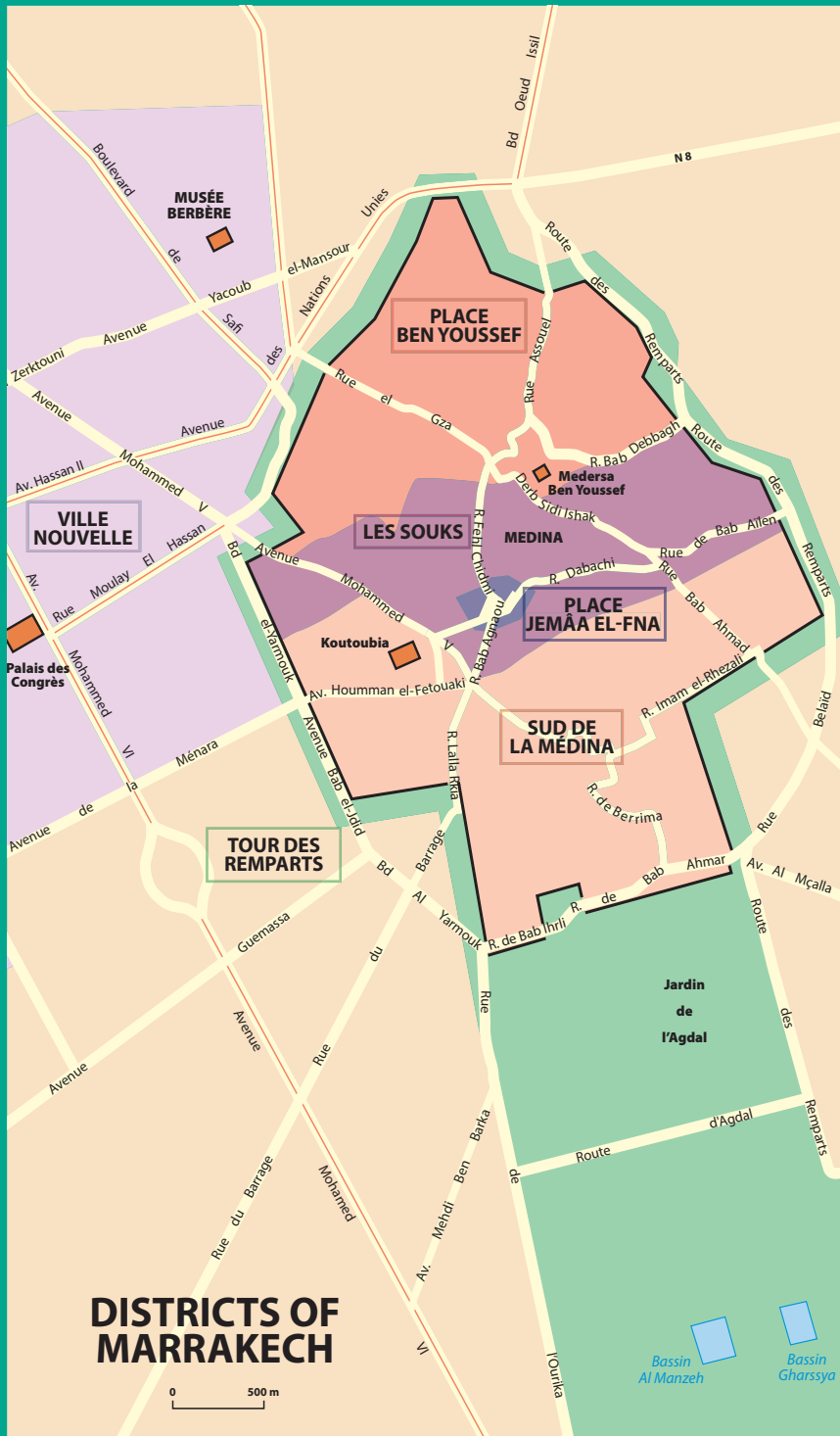

## MUST-SEE SITES

- 1** Michelin selection of Must-see sites
- 1** National parks and green spaces

### 1 Koutoubia\*\*\*

**MAP: D4** - The Koutoubia is a masterpiece of Almorhad art whose emblematic minaret is topped by a superb 70m/230ft-high square tower. The Koutoubia acquired its current look under the reign of Yacoub el-Mansour. Entry is forbidden to non-Muslims.

### 2 Marrakech Souks\*\*\*

**MAP: E3** - Here you can see Moroccan craftsmanship in all its diversity, organised by profession. Stroll through the crowds under a roof of reeds, passing craftsmen and tradesmen hawking leather goods, fabrics, kettles and pottery.

### 3 Jemâa el Fna Square\*\*\*

**MAP: E3** - In the heart of the medina, the square waits for the sun to go down before offering up its street shows, multiple stalls, crowds, noise and shouting, music and improvised food stalls. The highlight of the evening is the street art of "halka", recognised and protected by the UNESCO.

### 4 Saadian Tombs\*\*\*

**MAP: E5** - The sumptuous mausoleums of the Saadian dynasty were built in the late 16C by Ahmed "the Golden". A century later Moulay Ismail sealed them up behind a high wall. A passageway for non-Muslims was built in 1917.

### 5 Marrakech Ramparts\*\*

**MAP: C3** - Sultan Ali ben Youssef endowed Marrakech with its famous surrounding walls in 1132. Later extended, these 19km/12mi of adobe fortifications are flanked by 202 square towers and boast nine gates.

### 6 Bahia Palace and Gardens\*\*

**MAP: F4** - This palace matches the extravagance of the vizier who had it built in the 19 C, for his four wives and 24 concubines, thus explaining the maze of gardens, courtyards and lounges in the Arabic, Turkish or European styles.

### 7 Majorelle Garden\*\*

**MAP: C1** - J. Majorelle, a French artist from Nancy (1888-1962), developed a passion for Morocco where he lived in the 1920s. His garden is a hymn to colour and luxuriance, planted with species from all over the world.

### 8 Ben Youssef Madrasa\*\*

**MAP: E3** - The largest madrasa in North Africa (900 students), built c. 1570 and deconsecrated in 1960, is named after the nearby mosque. The whole shimmering white edifice has been magnificently restored.

### 9 Dar Si Saïd and Moroccan Arts Museum\*\*

**MAP: EF4** - Dar Si Saïd was the brother of vizier Ba Ahmed and this was his (19C) residence. It contains many treasures including the wooden doors visible in the corridor. The beauty of the setting, a luxuriant riad, highlights the collections.

### 10 Marrakech Palm Grove\*

**OFF MAP** - The country's northern-most palm grove is planted with almost 100 000 trees today. A lot of planting and irrigation work is still going on, despite the high-end land development.

### 11 Tanners' Quarter\*

**MAP: F3** - The Tanners' Quarter near Oued Issil stretches out within the ramparts. If you don't mind the mud and smell, feel free to go down for a close-up view of the tanning process and the hides drying in the sun near the vats.

### 12 M'Nebhi Palace and Marrakech Museum\*

**MAP: E3** - Art lover, collector and patron Omar Benjelloun created a foundation which has enabled, among other things, the restoration of the 19C M'Nebhi Palace home to the Marrakech Museum. Temporary exhibitions are staged here.

### 13 Dar Tiskiwin\*

**MAP: E4** - Bert Flint, a Dutchman and adopted Moroccan, has always known how to share his passion for Moroccan folk art. The Hispano-Moorish house provides a superb setting for his collections.

### 14 Menara Pavilion\*

**OFF MAP** - Built in 1866, this pavilion, set in magnificent gardens, was once a favourite spot for sultans to bring their companions. An ingenious irrigation system was constructed in this exceptional and emblematic setting, with the Atlas mountains in the background.

### 15 El-Badi Palace and Gardens\*

**MAP: E4-5** - Its extraordinary dimensions allow you a glimpse into the former splendour of this 16C palace. Demolished in the 17C, it still boasts beautiful gardens and the superb **ninbar\*\*\*** of the Koutoubia.

### 16 Agdal Gardens\*

**MAP: F6** - Built in the 12C and extended in the 19C, these vast gardens cover nearly 3km/1.8mi. Famous for their fruit trees and enormous olive grove.

### 17 Secret Garden

**MAP: E3** - Having long remained closed, the doors to this luxurious 19C palace now open onto two gardens designed by landscape artist Tom Stuart-Smith. Fine view from the tower.

### 18 Arsat Moulay Abdeslam Cyber Park

**MAP: C3** - This recently renovated 18C historic park is dotted with multimedia terminals. Very popular with the younger generation.

### 19 20 El Harti Park and Avenue Mohammed VI Gardens

**MAP: B2-D3** - These extensive public gardens, very popular with families, are planted with palm and orange trees and offer welcome shade right in the heart of the city.

**Taxi** - Taxis operate between the airport and the city (15min). Be sure to agree on a fare before departing because the drivers often refuse to use the meter on this route. Expect to pay around 70DH (around 6,50€) for a trip to the town centre (105DH at night) and 100DH to the palm grove (150DH at night).

**Bus** - A bus leaving from the airport stops at about 20 places over town - buses leave every 30min 6.15am-9.15pm - 20DH (around 1,80€), 30DH (around 2,70€) return. Another option is the N° 11 bus, to Jemâa el-Fna square in 20min (3DH - around 0,30€), but you will need to walk about 400m/430 yards to the airport exit before you can flag one down.

Main routes: the most useful are N°1 (from Jemâa el-Fna) to Gueliz from the medina via the main post office; N°3, 8, 10 and 14 to the bus and train stations; N°4 (from Jemâa el-Fna) to the Marjorelle gardens via the bus station; N°9 (from Jemâa el-Fna) to go around the ramparts; N°11 and N°20 (from Mamounia) to the Menara and the airport.
