Renato Redentor Constantino is a member of the Board of the Peoples Survival Fund, the first legislated Philippine adaptation funding mechanism dedicated to supporting the adaptation action agenda of local governments and communities. Constantino leads the climate policy group *Institute for Climate and Sustainable Cities*, which works on fair climate policy and low carbon resilience programs. Constantino is an Advisor to the Climate Vulnerable Forum, an advocacy group

composed of representatives from 43 governments of vulnerable countries in Asia, Africa, Latin America, the Pacific and the Caribbean. ICSC published the literary anthology and 2015 National Book Award winner *Agam: Filipino Narratives on Uncertainty and Climate Change*. Constantino is the author of *The Poverty of Memory: Essays on History and Empire*.

Constantino writes for several publications. His essays on history, memory, environment and development have been translated into several languages. Constantino worked for over a decade with international environment and development campaigning organizations, spanning South, Southeast, East, and Central Asia. Constantino runs a bar with his buddies called Fred's Revolución in Cubao Expo, Quezon City and Escolta, Manila.
