Concept Note

Objective

Youth participation in UNFCCC conferences has been rising steadily over the last years. This includes young representatives of governments, observer organizations and UNFCCC constituencies such as YOUNGO, Indigenous Peoples Organisations, Women and Gender, as well as other Environmental NGOs. This trend is also reflected in the growing number of organizations affiliated to YOUNGO.

This could be due to several factors including the invitation to Parties to include children and youth in their national delegation in Sharm el-Sheikh Implementation Plan (<u>Decision 1/CP,27 para. 59</u>), and the implementation of Action for Climate Empowerment (<u>ACE</u>) work programme (<u>Decision 18/CP.26</u>) and its action plan (<u>Decision 23/CP.27</u>), recognizing youth as agents of change in the climate change process. The establishment of the role of the Presidency Youth Climate Champion (<u>Decision 16/CP.28</u>), is also meant to further enhance this inclusive engagement of young people in the UNFCCC process.

The orientation session aims at providing a space for young delegates attending COP29, especially those attending for the first time, to be able to ask questions regarding the UNFCCC process, receive information on what is taking place at the COP29, how they can engage and network with other young delegates.

Targeted audience

The orientation session is offered to young delegates (under 35 years old) attending COP29. Seats will be made available to other delegates depending on room availability.
